# Veterans honored at OFHS

## John Maino emcees first Panthers Military Appreciation Night

**OCOnton FALLS** — Five local veterans were honored Friday night in the first-ever Military Appreciation Night at Oconto Falls High School.

They included Staff Sgt. Kurt Buhrandt, a logistical specialist for the Wisconsin National Guard who is in his 23rd year of service. He met the night's master of ceremonies, John Maino, when the longtime media personality was embedded in Afghanistan and Buhrandt was commander of convoy security, driving what Maino described as "the most hostile, most dangerous roads on the entire face of the Earth."

"Just before going out I asked him what's it like right now," Maino told the audience gathered in the high school field house. "He said, 'Right now you put your game face on, you strap in place, and you do your job. Nothing more, nothing less.'"

The other honorees were Marine Sgt. Ron Christensen, who served more than 20 years and is now Ocon-

to County Veterans Service Officer; Sgt. Bob Thomson, U.S. Air Force; Navy Corpsman Bob Maloney; and Radarman 3rd Class Leslie "Butch" Vorpahl, U.S. Navy.

Maloney, who was a key figure in the campaign to build the new Oconto Falls Area Veterans Monument, gave a "shout out" to OFHS boys basketball coach Gary Regal for initiating the idea of a Military Night.

"I want you to know how important this is to all of the veterans who serve," Maloney said. "When you go up to them in the grocery store and you say, 'Thanks for your service,' and we just shake our head and we say thank you, but that stays with us all day ... as a group of veterans, I just want to say thank you for Military Night, Oconto Falls. Thank you."

Christensen put in a "public service announcement" for the Veterans Services Office, which has the mission of connecting veterans with the benefits they've earned.

"Our county and especially this community is very supportive of our veterans," Christensen said. "Most of us woke up this morning not giving much thought that our country is still at war and that we have troops deployed all over the world, but they make that sacrifice so that we can enjoy events like this tonight."

Maino said in three journeys embedded with troops in Iraq and Afghanistan, he saw the power of

sports as the service people he met would ask how the Packers or their high school teams were doing.

Maino said he asked the troops to write down the top 10 things they missed while deployed that they probably didn't appreciate until they were far from home.

"So many of them wrote down, the smell of walking into a high school basketball game, the smell of that popcorn - the sound of a high school band - the smell of fresh-cut grass - the sound of hearing a band playing on Friday night when you see the lights on at a high school stadium and you're walking up to those lights," Maino said. "Those are some of the things the guys wrote that they said they will never, ever take for granted ever again."

He told the crowd that Friday night's games were a part of all that.

"Without trying to sound corny, that's kind of what our people fight for," Maino said, "because this is the American way - being able to enjoy sporting events and come into a gym like this and hearing a phenomenal band like this and a choir like this, and high school football games and wrestling matches and all those great things - that's America, that's what all of these gentlemen raised their right hand and said they're ready willing and able to give up their lives for."

# Veterans' records to be digitized

## Questions raised about the fate of original paper documents

**OCONTO** — A Wausau firm has been hired to digitize hundreds of thousands of Oconto County veterans' records dating back more than a century.

The County Board voted 29-1 Thursday to approve a contract with Q Solutions to scan about 9,900 folders containing an estimated 385,000 paper documents of county veterans who served as far back as the Spanish-American War and World War I.

"The purpose of this is to preserve the historical value, properly secure and safeguard the records and

improve the efficiency in our office," Veterans Service Officer Ron Christensen told the board.

Most of the work Christensen's office does with veterans now happens on computer screens, he said.

"We haven't created a paper file in our office since a month after I started, so about three years ago. Everything's in the cloud," Christensen said.

Q Solutions would start work in March, with completion expected by June. The digital files would be stored in two places, at the courthouse and one on a company server.

The plan as forwarded by the county Finance/Insurance Committee would be for Q Solutions to shred most of the documents. The paper copy of each veteran's official discharge document, known as the DD214, would be returned to the county if it's in the file.

That part of the project drew sharp opposition from several supervisors. David Behrend said the county ought to find someone who can be a caretaker of the original

documents.

"Being that I am an archivist, and I think of 1850 as being yesterday, it would strongly advisable to find a group that wants them and decide what can be released as far as private information. But a lot of that stuff goes 90 years out and then becomes public record," Behrend said. "When you're looking for factual information, a digital record really doesn't count because anybody can change it."

The State Historical Society had a case about 10 years ago when a Medal of Honor recipient came looking for an original document and it had been shredded, leading to a legal battle, Behrend said.

"Once you get rid of it, it'll never come back," he said.

Christensen said his office doesn't have the resources to go out and find veterans to see if they want to have the records.

"If we have a fire here or something, they're lost forever," Christensen said. "I think the proper way to secure them and preserve them is

not to leave them on paper."

Supervisor Diane Nichols, who is a historian, cautioned against destroying paper records without consulting the State Historical Society.

"As I understand it, any public record on a county level before it's destroyed needs to be offered to the historical society," Nichols said. "If they say you can shred it, then you can, but I think they need to be contacted."

Supervisor Rose Stellmacher suggested putting a notice in newspapers so that veterans' families are aware that the information will be shredded, and if they're interested in having them, they can come to the Veterans Service Office.

"That's a great idea," Christensen said.

The contract requires Q Solutions to "store records in a secure area until receiving approval from Oconto County to destroy by shredding," according to the resolution.

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# Officials fear southern floods and northern wildfires

## Local, state and federal officials meet to discuss scenarios

**OCONTO** — The threat of fire danger looms in northern Oconto County over the next two or three years, as the southern part of the county braces for severe flooding.

The County Board received an update Thursday from Emergency Management Director Tim Magnin regarding the aftermath of last summer's windstorm that downed hundreds of thousands of trees, as well as flooding that plagued the city of Oconto and other bayshore communities around New Year's.

Town and county officials have submitted applications for disaster aid from FEMA, the Federal Emergency

Management Agency, for reimbursement of cleanup costs from the July 19 macroburst that leveled a huge swath of forest land in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest.

"They're willing to help us try to get the maximum dollar figure we can to help get through this event," Magnin said.

The state Department of Natural Resources and U.S. Forest Service are both concerned that as time goes on, the fire danger could increase.

"What they're looking at is, they're worried about this year but also probably over the next two, three years, it's going to dry out even more, so they're trying to clean things up," Magnin said.

A recent meeting of FEMA, the DNR and local officials yielded much information and a good planning session, he said.

Meanwhile, the county has completed one application for Wisconsin disaster funds stemming from heavy flooding in October and is in the process of preparing a second application for the flooding that occurred Dec. 31 and Jan. 1, when ice jams on the

Oconto River led to flooding in the city of Oconto.

A meeting occurred Jan. 22 involving county and municipal leaders from the city and the towns of Little River, Little Suamico, Oconto and Pensaukee, planning a response to record-high water levels on Lake Michigan that would be similar to the response up north last July, Magnin said.

"We're going to plan for the worst and hope we don't get anything, but I think we're going to get hit with something," he said. "I think this little hit we had, end of December and beginning of January, was just a little warning of what's coming for the

spring."

Paul Ehrfurth, executive director of the Oconto County Economic Development Corp., reported that OCEDC is working with Bay-Lake to help property owners who sustained flood damage.

"As you know our loan program is a maximum \$10,000, but Bay-Lake has launched a disaster relief program for Oconto with a maximum \$20,000," Ehrfurth said. "We have identified at least two property owners with much damage and are working with them to see if we can work together a package for them."

## Red Cross cites need for Type O donations

The American Red Cross has extended its urgent call for donors of all blood types to give blood or platelets. With influenza escalating across the country and preventing some donors from giving, and winter weather threatening to cancel blood drives, the Red Cross says there is a critical shortage of type O blood.

Currently, the organization has less than a three-day supply of type O blood available. Type O positive blood is the most-transfused blood type and can be given to Rh-positive patients of any blood type. While just 7% of the U.S. population has type O negative blood, it can be transfused to patients with any blood type and is what hospital staff reach for during emergencies when there

isn't time to determine a patient's blood type.

# Lakewood DNR station has new conservation warden

**LAKEWOOD** — A Michigan native who served the country in military deployments to Somalia and Haiti before starting his law enforcement career is the new state conservation warden based at Lakewood in Oconto County.

Jamin Leuzzo, born and raised in the Upper Peninsula Michigan town of Bessemer, was hired by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' Bureau of Law Enforcement in late 2018 to serve the public as a conservation warden assigned to the Peshtigo Warden Team.

An outdoors guy who fishes, grouse hunts and enjoys exploring the outdoors with his wife, Leuzzo didn't waste any time throwing himself into public service once high school was in the rear-view mirror.

"After graduation, I enlisted in the United States Army with the 10th Mountain Division in Fort Drum, N.Y. as an infantryman," he said. Off he went to Somalia and Haiti.

Once he was stateside, his public service didn't end. He worked in correctional facilities for adult men



in South Dakota and Minnesota, with the last dozen years as a K-9 handler. He also worked as a crime analyst for the Duluth Police Department/Lake Superior Drug and Violent Crimes

Task Force in Duluth for about two years before joining the DNR warden service.

Warden Leuzzo will serve the Oconto County communities of Townsend, Lakewood, Doty, River-view, Mountain, Brazeau, Breed and Bagley from the Lakewood Field Station. # Houseplants color up interior during cold months

The holidays are over, and many gardeners are looking to add some color to the home to brighten up the heart of winter. There are many wonderful winter houseplants that help fulfill this winter dream.

Blooming houseplants are wonderful additions to the home to brighten and warm our homes as the snow piles up outside and winter's cold settles in.

Most are easy to care for, as long as they are provided a reliable light source and watered properly.

ing plants, in general, require a bit more light and fairly consistent moisture when compared to foliage plants that are a bit more tolerant of diverse conditions.

as paper whites and Amaryllis, often received as gifts. These are easy to grow and nearly flawless.

So easy, in fact, are amaryllis bulbs that a new trend in this beautiful bloomer is wax coated bulbs that need no care whatsoever. This includes watering. The bulb encased in a colorful wax coating has everything it needs to grow and bloom inside the home. Simply place in a bright sunny location and let Mother Nature do the rest.

Indoor azaleas are another beau-

tiful bloomer that lasts throughout most of the winter season. These small, woody shrubs are available in pink, red, lavender and white. These are different than our outdoor, perennial azalea shrubs and are not hardy over winter outdoors.

Indoor azalea shrubs are easy to take care for, provided they are not allowed to dry out. Keep moisture levels consistent — moist, but not wet — as well as medium to high light. Fertilize with Miracid or other acidic plant fertilizer accord

ing to the package directions.

Anthuriums, sometimes known as flamingo plants, are another wonderful source of indoor color to brighten the home during the winter season. Their beautiful, spathe-like blooms come in a variety of colors such as white, pink, red and purple.

Anthuriums are tolerant of lower light levels and can be allowed to go quite dry in between deep waterings. Their long-lasting flowers may bloom for weeks, and new flower buds are constantly emerging from below.

Many varieties of succulents provide stunning blooms in the indoor garden during the winter season. Kalanchoe is especially attractive with clusters of colorful blooms that adorn these small to medium-sized plants for many weeks over their long bloom season.

These plants bloom in many colors, such as yellow, orange, pink, red, white, coral and others. Be-

cause these are succulents, be careful not to overwater and be sure to provide plenty of bright light.

Of course, no indoor garden should be without colorful, ornate and elegant blooming orchids throughout the year. Especially in winter, many orchids put on a fantastic display. They come in a variety of shapes, colors and sizes. Some orchids are easier to care for than others, so be sure to purchase from a reputable dealer and ask plenty of questions.

African violets are another traditional indoor gardening favorite for the winter season. While they have a reputation of being touchy, they are quite easy to grow, especially under growing lights, provided they are not allowed to dry out. Plant in a violet-specific potting mix and fertilize regularly.

# Oconto Falls girls finish strong to earn road win over Clintonville

## Brauer hits go-ahead shot for Panthers

**CLINTONVILLE** — Oconto Falls senior Natalie Brauer hit the go-ahead shot with about 18 seconds to play and then secured a game-sealing offensive rebound with under five seconds left to lift the Panthers to a 54-51 North Eastern Conference victory over Clintonville on Thursday.

Despite dealing with foul trouble throughout the game and trailing by eight points with 6 minutes, 30 seconds to play, Oconto Falls was still able to secure the road win by ending the game on a 15-4 run.

"It's a big win. Clintonville is a nice team and they've been on a roll, so to come into their place and beat them, yeah, it's going to give us confidence," said Oconto Falls coach Mike Kaczmarek Jr. "We've got to clean some things up but by battling back through adversity in the second half, I think it's going to speak volumes down the stretch."

After Clintonville hit a 3-pointer to go up 47-39, Oconto Falls senior Kari Albrecht buried a triple of her own. Brauer added a field goal a minute later to cut the team's deficit to three.

A pair of Clintonville free throws pushed the deficit back to five with just over four minutes to play, but Panther senior Morgan Helmle answered with a 3-pointer. After the hosting Truckers missed the first free throw of a 1-and-1 opportunity, Albrecht drilled another 3-pointer to give Oconto Falls the lead with just over two-and-a-half minutes to play.

Both teams missed free throws over the next couple minutes before Clintonville called timeout with 41.7 seconds to play, with Oconto Falls

still leading 50-49.

The Truckers converted a shot near the 33-second mark, but the Panthers were able to answer with Brauer's field goal.

Clintonville had a chance to tie or take the lead with 9.9 seconds left, but missed a pair of free throws.

Oconto Falls junior McKayla Goebel was fouled and sent to the free-throw line for a one-and-one opportunity with 8.5 seconds left —

she hit the first shot before missing the second. Oconto Falls grabbed the loose ball and then called timeout with 4.9 seconds left.

Brauer was fouled with 3 seconds left, making the first free throw and then grabbing an offensive rebound after missing the second shot. Brauer missed a putback attempt, but the clock ran out in the process, sealing Oconto Falls' wild win.

"I think this shows that we can

finish games — there's lots of teams that can't finish games. I feel like like that's where our momentum came in. We all stood up and we were really confident that we were going to win the game," said Brauer.

"We just brought up our intensity when we had to and just played our game. When it came down to the line, we stepped it up," said Albrecht. "We made our shots, got to the basket, played good defense — we all just played good as a team."

Albrecht finished with a team-leading 18 points for Oconto Falls, carrying the team for much of the first half when it was battling serious foul trouble. Albrecht scored all eight of her first-half points in the first eight minutes to give the visitors a 14-6 lead.

Goebel, Brauer and Albrecht all picked up two fouls within the first 11 minutes of the game. Brauer was tagged for her third foul at the 4:44 mark before Albrecht picked up her third at the 3:21 mark.

Goebel and Helmle each knocked down two triples in the first half and finished the game with nine points each. Brauer finished with 12 points.

The foul issues forced Kaczmarek to limit his starters minutes in the second half, but the girls off the bench kept the Truckers from pulling away.

"The bench really stepped up a notch tonight. They kept us in the game, they kept us where they had to be," said Kaczmarek. "We had good possessions (offensively), and defensively they might have been over-matched but they did a nice job of getting stops when they needed to."

# Suring boys dominate in road win

**BOWLER** — The Suring High School boys basketball put together one of its best games of the season in a nonconference matchup against Bowler on Friday, taking control early on and rolling to a 77-43 win.

Senior Bryce Losurdo followed with a fastbreak layup before senior Jayden Geniesse and Losurdo hit 3-pointers.

Suring's next two field goals came near the rim, as senior Dequez Sepulveda converted a shot after grabbing an offensive rebound and senior Ethan Hischke stole the ball before laying it in.

After a Bowler timeout, Sepulveda knocked down another shot to up Suring's lead to 21-5 a little more than

five minutes into the game.

"I think a big reason why we're as good against zone (defense) as we are is because at the start of the season, we weren't good at man (to-man defense) so I went zone and we've seen how we've got beat in zone. I slowly steered away from it because zone is a scary thing to play if you don't move well (on defense)," said

Chris Geniesse. "I think we learned ball movement, having a guy high post, having a guy short corner and just moving the ball as fast as you can because the zone can't keep up with you. Us getting beat running zone made us just know how to play against it."

While Suring's offense wasn't able to keep up its fast pace, its defense locked up Bowler, which allowed the visitors to run away with the game.

Suring held Bowler scoreless for over six minutes on its 17-0 run. The hosts scored their next six points in a three-minute span before the Eagles allowed just three points in the final six minutes of the half.

"Our defense has been getting better and better every game," said Hischke. "We have been playing great help defense and that carried into this game as well."

Losurdo led a 3-point barrage that helped Suring extend its lead to 24. Losurdo hit three triples over a two-minute span to cap his 16-point first half.

The win was Suring's third in the last four games, with the lone loss coming on a buzzer beater. All of Suring's wins have come since Dec. 19 after starting the season 0-5.

"We've been on a really good roll lately. I think we could be a scary team down the stretch — I'm really excited for the second half of the season," said Chris Geniesse.

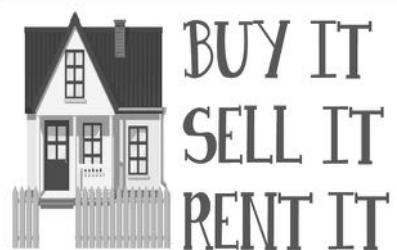
