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School district's prelim budget includes deficit

Board looks at using ESSER funds to erase \$434K deficit for 2021-22 school year

The Shawano School District will need to figure out where to cut over \$434,000 from its 2021-22 budget after the Shawano School Board signed off July 19 on some preliminary figures.

According to Finance Director Josh Swanson, the deficit is coming about due to the continued decline in enrollment, something the district has seen in the last five years, as well as the state keeping school districts' revenue limits flat with previous years. The preliminary budget is just shy of \$31 million, while the district operated with a budget of \$30.4 million this past school year, which ended June 30.

The projected revenue for 2021-22, however, is \$30.55 million, so the district will need to find a way to either obtain additional funds or cut the budget before the final numbers are approved at the end of October. Swanson said the revenue figures will be dependent on what the final numbers are for summer school enrollment and what the enrollment for the third Friday in September is, a benchmark that the state uses to decide how much funding a school district gets.

"We're looking at about a \$550,000 decrease in our revenue cap, which is the amount we're able to generate per student, so those factors all play into the budget deficit for next year," Swanson said.

He noted that the school district could get some funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) fund, which comes out of the state's Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) fund, but he pointed out that those funds will not renew on an annual basis and the district would

have to eventually cut somewhere down the line.

"Those grant funds do expire, so we don't want to put those in the budget on a long-term basis," Swanson said. "Eventually those funds will dry up, so we want to use those funds for one-time purchases."

Board member Mart Grams questioned why cuts aren't already being implemented, given the size of the deficit.

"We're short a half a million dollars. Somebody's got to go," Grams said.

Board member Diane Hoffman pointed out that the budget being approved was preliminary, and that the work to balance the budget will come in the next few months.

"Those are the tough discussions that we're not having at the moment," Hoffman said. "We're presenting a proposed budget, which will show those shortcuts. We have to put it out there. The finalizing of it with the tax levy will come in October after we have all of our student counts data in. We have to present a budget based on the numbers we know we have."

Hoffman said the ESSER funds were intentionally left out, as the district didn't want to use them to bolster the district's operational costs.

Grams believes the district should at least be mapping out scenarios where cuts will need to be made in the event that additional funding doesn't materialize.

"Are we just going to hope and pray that the state changes its mind?" Grams said.

Superintendent Randi Anderson pointed out that administrators presented three scenarios to the district's finance committee in February — one with a zero increase in per pupil aid from the state, one with the \$200 an-

nual increase that school districts have seen from the state for several years, and the third one showing an increase above that.

"At that time, the administration said, if we don't make reductions in staff, we would be looking at about a \$500,000 deficit moving into the 2021-22 school year," Anderson said. "At that point, the finance committee said let's move forward with the current staff that we have, knowing we would have to use some of the ESSER dollars to backfill that and start to have those conversations as we move into the 2021-22 school year."

The district won't be able to kick the can down the road forever, Anderson said.

"We are in a declining-enrollment district, and that right-sizing conversation is going to happen as we move forward," she said.

For Grams, using one-time dollars and not making necessary cuts did not sit well, and he was concerned that taxpayers might have to suffer the consequences. He noted that people who are not part of government might not see the deficit as something that can easily be fixed.

"As a personal example, I'm over \$2,000 in spending. That means next month I don't get to spend \$2,000," Grams said. "When we're short as a government, we just tax people more or hope some other government fills in the hole. That's not how we're supposed to run things. When we have less money, the taxpayers — be they federal or local — should not have to fill in the hole. We need to cut somewhere." Grams added the matter needs to be taken up by the finance committee immediately, in his view.

Interest swells in Shawano all-day 4K program

District able to add third class, which is expected to help keep students, families in Shawano

The Shawano School District has surpassed its original vision for all-day 4-year-old kindergarten, according to a report presented to the Shawano School Board on July 19.

Originally, the district anticipated two classes of all-day 4K, along with some half-day classes, when it approved the plan to offer all-day classes several months ago. The plan included a potential lottery system if the enrollment of all-day students went past the capacity for the two classes, but there were enough students enrolled to have a third all-day class. This leaves Hillcrest Primary School with two of the classes and LEADS Primary Charter School with one.

Hillcrest principal Troy Edwards said that 51 students had been enrolled for all-day 4K by the district's June 30 deadline, with classrooms having a cap of 20 students. There are five other students on a waiting list, as well as 56 students enrolled for half-day 4K.

Edwards said he discussed the possibility of adding the third all-day

class with the district's finance committee, which gave its blessing.

The 4K program has seen popularity in previous years. The district had 127 students enrolled in 4K in the 2018-19 school years and 114 in 2019-20. Enrollment dropped in 2020-21 due to the coronavirus pandemic, according to Edwards, and the district only had 99 students.

"Our interest is definitely up," Edwards said. "We're reversing the trend of our downward slide in enrollment numbers, which is very exciting, and I'm attributing it to the fact that we have that all-day option."

The all-day 4K is expected to help the district reach its grade-level goals, something that has not been happening with the half-day program. With its reading goal for students to be able to identify 21 letters in the alphabet, a goal of 75% was set for the last school year, but only 60%

achieved, according to Edwards. A math goal of 80% being able to identify numbers fell far short at 46%, and another math goal for counting set at 72% only saw 55% of students reach the benchmark.

"While we get close, we have yet to reach that mark," Edwards said. "This would definitely be an opportunity to provide more instructional opportunities."

All-day 4K is also expected to help bring families into the district and keep them here. Edwards said some families enrolled had mentioned they would attend other schools with all-day 4K if Shawano did not offer its own. Doing this will hopefully encourage families to stay with Shawano public schools into 5-year-old

kindergarten and beyond, he said.

"We have families on this list who have attended other schools, including parochial schools," Edwards said. "I know we have several on the list that have been checking in with us to see if we had final information on whether we could add another section or not because there are deadlines at other schools and they planned to attend other schools if we did not offer the all-day 4K options for them. If you're looking at long-term retention, we don't have to worry about them going to other schools and liking it and wanting to stay."

Besides the academic benefits, the all-day program will allow for increased time to focus on students' emotional development, according to Edwards, as well as develop the basics of being in school, making it easier to go into future grades. Families would have two meals covered through the program, as opposed to one for a half-day.

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Democrats march, rally for fair maps

Former legislator urges residents to call representatives and urge support for bills

The Shawano County Democrats kicked off their education blitz on the planned redistricting of Wisconsin on July 17 with a march and rally at the courthouse that brought out over a dozen people.

The Democrats are seeking to have a nonpartisan commission draw the maps, a requirement every 10 years as the U.S. Census data, arguing that the maps were heavily gerrymandered in 2010, guaranteeing that Republicans continue to have strong majorities in both the Assembly and Senate. They believe that the gerrymandering has led to those with extreme views on both the right and left getting elected to office, reducing cooperation and compromise and leading to gridlock.

Fifty-one counties have passed advisory resolutions in support of the nonpartisan commission, and 17 counties have passed advisory referenda with voters. Shawano and Menominee counties have done neither, while Oconto County has approved a resolution.

Former state Rep. Penny Bernard Schaber, who represented the 57th Assembly District for six years until she was defeated in 2014 while making a run for state Senate, led the rallying cry in Shawano on July 17, urging Democrats to call on local legislators to support Assembly Bill 395 and Senate Bill 389, which both call for the formation of the commission.

"Fairness in government is what we need, but in my mind, the most important issue we have to deal with is gerrymandering," Bernard Schaber said. "We have to have fair maps. We have to end gerrymandering in Wisconsin because, if we don't, nothing else will get done."

Bernard Schaber argued that nothing is getting done in the legislature, and that giving candidates on both sides a fighting chance in elections is the way to solve the issue.

"Nothing of substance is getting done," she said. "If we want a clean environment, if we want good health care, if we want to have education that works well for everybody ... we have to end gerrymandering."

Bernard Schaber noted the legis-

lative bills are languishing in inactive committees at the moment, thus the need for contacting legislators on the issues.

"We have to call the committee people and tell them you want a public hearing," Bernard Schaber said. "We have to ask them to be active

and to do something."

The call to action is not just for those sitting on committees looking at the bills. Bernard Schaber said the Democrats in attendance needed to contact all legislators to demand action be taken.

"It's our job to tell the representatives and our senators to do what we ask them to do, not what the big parties ask them to, not what WMC — the Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce — tells them to do," Bernard Schaber said. "It's their job to listen to us, and to do what we ask them and tell them to do."

To not call legislators on the issue would give the impression that it's not a pressing issue among constituents, according to Bernard Schaber.

"If you don't call them, they'll say, 'Oh, it's not important,'" she said. "You even have to call people that you know support the bills because they'll think it's not important."

Menominee County tops tax refund list for Wisconsin

Menominee County recently topped the list of a study conducted regarding tax refunds in Wisconsin.

This study was run to determine which county received the largest tax refunds for the 2021 year. The study was run by SmartAsset.

According to Steve Saboto, a

spokesman for SmartAsset, the county was also ranked No. 1 in the state for highest tax refunds in 2018 and 2020. They also ranked No. 2 in the state in 2019.

“To determine the counties that received the highest average refunds, we divided the total amount of money refunded by the IRS in each county by the number of refunds issued in each county,” said Saboto.

The study is run in order to have people more interested and considerate of their financial goals and gives them an intention of how they can reach their goals.

“This study in particular provides a county-by-county look at the places where people received the highest average tax refunds and the counties where people owed the most money after filling their taxes,” said Saboto.

Saboto believes that the importance of this study is to help identify the difference of tax refunds in counties in Wisconsin.

“Our study helps identify where that is happening in Wisconsin at the greatest scale,” said Saboto. “Seeing these numbers also helps provide local contest for people who may want to see how their refund compares to the average in the county and the state.”

Milwaukee wins 2nd NBA title behind 50-point game from Giannis

Giannis Antetokounmpo ended one of the greatest NBA Finals ever with 50 points — and a championship Milwaukee waited 50 years to win again.

Antetokounmpo had 50 points, 14 rebounds and five blocked shots as the Bucks beat the Phoenix Suns 105-98 on July 20 to win the series 4-2.

It was the third game this series with at least 40 points and 10

rebounds for Antetokounmpo, a dominant, debut finals performance that takes its place among some of the game's greatest.

He shot 16 for 25 from the field and made an unbelievable 17-of-19 free throws — a spectacular performance for any shooter, let alone one who was hitting just 55.6% in the postseason and was ridiculed for it at times.

He hopped around the court waving his arms with 20 seconds remaining to encourage fans to cheer,

but it was way too late for that.

Their voices had been booming inside and outside for hours by then, having waited 50 years to celebrate a winner after Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Oscar Robertson led the Bucks to the championship in 1971.

In a season played largely without fans, the Bucks had 65,000

of them packed into the Deer District outside, a wild party that figured to last deep into the Midwestern night.

Confetti rained down inside as fans chanted "Bucks in 6! Bucks in 6!" — what began as a hopeful boast by former player turned out to be a prophetic rallying cry.

The Bucks became the fifth team to win the NBA Finals after trailing 2-0 and the first to do it by winning the next four games since Miami against Dallas in 2006.

"The lemonade is fresh squeezed," said Weed. "We slice them and smash them."

With his reopening, Weed has noticed that many people in the area are

Weed anticipates there to be crowds of people throughout the first month or so of the reopening.

"We always stay on it," said Weed. "It may be like this the first month or so."

He attributes the first-day sellout to

"It is almost emotional to see all of this support," Weed said. "When you have a line that reaches the street, it may seem overwhelming, but they are willing to wait."

“My partner, Amber, mentioned that she knew the owners of Vienna

Weed stipulated that he would go in on the idea if he could include the “J Dogg,” a chili cheese dog, which has become a signature item at the stand. Weed’s previous boss gave him the nickname J-Dogg.

Weed has made the stand a big part of his life, even tattooing its logo on his leg.

J Doggs hot dog stand is open 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday.

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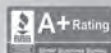
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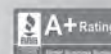
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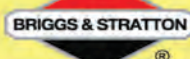
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CMN offers sustainable ag degree program

The program is an extension of the Associate of Arts and Sciences Natural Resources program at CMN.

The focus of this new program centers on sustainability among Indigenous nations and communities. Although not a commonly used term, "food sovereignty" has gained local interest. The need to address food-related issues and general community interest in learning about traditional foods, gardening and improved wellness through relationships with the natural environment stems from community input sessions held in 2015 and 2016. In 2019, CMN faculty and staff began working on the development of this program.

Sustainable agriculture is about addressing issues of land sovereignty, natural systems, government policies, ancient to modern technolo-

gies, economics, and human biological and social systems. Upon completion, graduates will be resilient and creative with the ability to think critically, communicate and enhance the lives of those in Indigenous communities and beyond.

Degree holders in this program can be self-employed or seek employment in agricultural production, food and nutrition, natural resources and other areas. In addition, they may continue with their higher education enrolling in a graduate program.

Any associate degree graduates in natural resources from CMN and other accredited institutions are encouraged to apply for the upcoming Fall 2021 semester.

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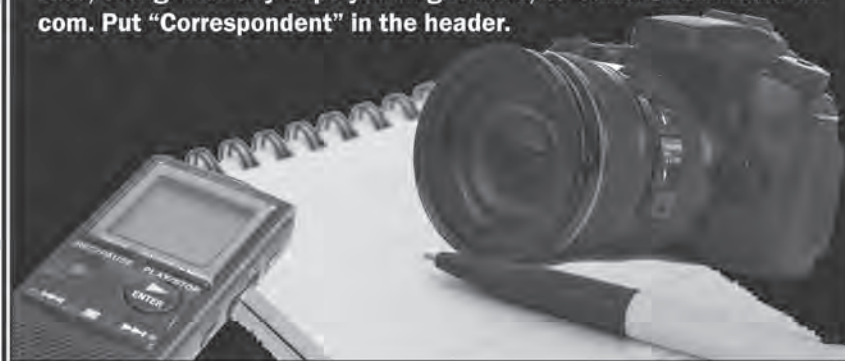

Package different, essentials stay the same

The first newscast I ever delivered on the radio was 18 minutes long, including the commercials. I started reading at 7:37 a.m. after Paul Harvey News and Comment, and I filled the time until the 7:55 a.m. ABC newscast.

Nowadays, a radio newscast runs about three minutes, if the station carries news at all. I remember playing audio clips that ran 30-40 seconds. Today's sound bites are in the neighborhood of 10.

The first comic book I ever bought cost me 10 cents and was 32 pages long, including the ads. Twenty years earlier, that dime would have bought 64 pages; 10 years earlier, it was 48. The last one I saw for sale was still 32 pages but it was priced around \$3.99, and the pages were narrower than they'd been in 1961.

When I started my first job at a supermarket, we stocked the shelves with 3-pound cans of coffee. Now those cans hold about 2 pounds and a fraction. Remember half-gallon packs of ice cream? They're a quart and a half these days.

Stuff changes. It gets shorter,

more expensive, smaller or all of the above.

The reasons are almost always economic: The businesses raise the price to cover their rising costs, or they reduce the size of the product so they

can hold the price steady.

When DC Comics raised the price of their books to 12 cents, they ran a full-page text ad to explain why. I still remember appreciating that explanation.

This newspaper isn't what it was even a few years ago. The Shawano Leader is a weekly. It shares about half of its content with the Oconto County Times Herald and Wittenberg-Birnamwood Enterprise-News; the other half is unique to each community.

The reasons are economic, of course. The semi-merged papers began as an emergency reaction to the pandemic-related business lock-

downs. Advertisers ordered to close their doors had no need to buy ads. Our choices were to go smaller or go away.

Businesses are reopening and rebuilding, and so are we, but some of those advertisers are struggling to recover and others did not survive. So it's hard to say when or if the papers will become separate entities again. We consider ourselves fortunate to be among the survivors, especially since the newspaper business had already been shrinking for more than a decade.

We've adapted, too, of course. The local news and sports you used to see in your daily paper is now posted online at www.newmedia-wi.com every day. The local news and sports you used to wait to see in the weekly papers is now available every day.

The staff is smaller than it was, partly because of economics and partly because it's not easy to find help in these times. We're working on that. Know any good reporters looking for a change? Send them our way.

What hasn't changed is the com-

mitment of the people who are still here turning out the news and sports for you. These are our communities, and we're here to tell their stories — the triumphs and the tragedies and the beauty and the warts and all.

The package is different, but there's still stuff here that you won't find anywhere else.

Boy, do we appreciate that you've stuck with us through all of what the past year — years — have brought. Thank you for every news tip, ad, subscription or single-copy purchase. Thank you for talking with friends about the stories you see here. Heck, thank you for complaining, because complaints mean you care enough to let us know what we can do better.

I hope I've helped you understand why we're smaller and don't cost a dime anymore. I hope I've reassured you that our mission hasn't changed. I hope you'll stick around and help us tell our community's amazing story together.

Evers puts money back in for public schools

To the editor:

This past year, students and their families, schools and educators had to sacrifice so much. The one-time \$2.3 billion in federal funding from the American Rescue Plan was meant to help public schools recover. However, the funding was not meant to relieve the state of its responsibility. By law, federal funding will not be received by any legislature that fails to increase education funding by at least \$387 million over the next two years.

The original Republican sup-

ported 2021-2023 budget sent to Gov. Tony Evers cut his budget to \$128 million, thus putting the federal aid in jeopardy. The governor, who cares deeply about education, did not want Wisconsin lose the federal funding. Therefore, he used his constitutional authority to revise the budget adding \$100 million in recovery funds to invest in Wisconsin's classrooms.

Districts will now be able to use these funds for non-pandemic-related expenses such as hiring educators and staff, providing additional educational or mental health supports or buying computers.

This is such a breath of fresh air after Wisconsin had been ranked

49th in the nation for per-pupil education investment increases. Over the past decade, Wisconsin's investment in K-12 per pupil spending had increased a measly 4.3% compared to 18.9% nationwide. The Joint Committee on Finance had a chance to change that in the 2021-23 budget, but it took the governor to prioritize our children and their education.

In the past, the state of Wisconsin had one of the best public school systems in the nation. Part of this was due to state funding which provided two-thirds of the cost. For two decades, this has not been the case, and the local taxpayers have had to support their school districts. This made it difficult for many rural

school districts to provide a quality education. Thanks to Evers, the 2021-23 biennial budget provides roughly \$685 million in additional net general and categorical school aids. This funding restores the state's commitment to providing two-thirds of the cost.

There will be \$89 million that the governor put into reimbursement for students with disabilities and \$19 million in school mental health programs. These services had been drastically underfunded.

As a retired educator, it is heartening and a relief to see our state putting money back into the education of our children.

to an unrecognizable blackened blob. Whether you're one of the lucky folks feasting on a grillmaster's handiwork or instead find yourself chomping on charred protein, will you know where the beef on your plate originated?

After seeing store shelves stripped bare during the COVID-19 lockdown, many consumers have become more conscious of the fragility in the U.S. food supply. Interest in buying locally surged, which is why many customers reach for beef with the label "Product of the USA" in the cooler. Many, understandably, will think that in doing so, they're supporting U.S. farmers and buying beef from cattle that are born and raised in the USA.

Unfortunately, that's where the disconnect lies.

Sometimes that meat is actually from animals that never took a breath in America. Currently, meat can have a "Product of the USA" label slapped on even if it was imported and only repackaged at a U.S. Department of Agriculture-inspected facility.

I think that's bologna. Thankfully, so does the National Farmers Union (NFU), and they've raised concerns about it, alongside ranchers and farm organizations from throughout the country.

Those efforts may be paying off. On July 1, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced it would conduct a "top-to-bottom review" of the "Product of the USA" label.

This is good news for farmers and ranchers who know how the label tricks customers into thinking beef and pork is truly an American product even in cases where it was born, raised and slaughtered in another country.

This isn't just a problem for consumers — it hurts farmers who can't differentiate their product while trying to survive against the competing powers of multinational corporations.

My family raises beef cattle in northwestern Wisconsin. We have marketed cattle through conventional channels but are shifting to direct marketing to family, friends and

neighbors. The switch was spurred partly by our frustration at deceptive labeling and how, when marketed through traditional avenues, the beef from our animals — born and raised here in Wisconsin — has no edge in the marketplace over imports that are pouring into our country from places like Brazil, Mexico and Canada.

The fact that our government allows the stamp of "Product of the USA" on meat from an animal that never set a hoof on American soil should give us all pause. This loophole is slowly and painfully pushing American farmers out of business.

Over the past few decades, the U.S. has experienced a concerning level of consolidation in agriculture. Four major meatpacking companies — Cargill, Tyson, JBS and National Beef — now control over 85% of the American beef market. In turn, farmers have incredibly little control over the slim margin they receive. For example, that top sirloin steak that averages \$9.99 a pound? According to NFU's tracking of USDA data, the farmer's share is \$1.90. Misleading labels exacerbate these already difficult market conditions.

Still, farmers are out here rolling the dice. Many of us play the game because we feel a strong tie to the land and a desire to protect it for future generations. We believe that, in a world where something as clear-cut as "Product of the USA" is being watered down, it's important for there to be family farmers — and organizations like Farmers Union — safeguarding our supply chain and providing an alternative to this sad status quo that has become the American food system.

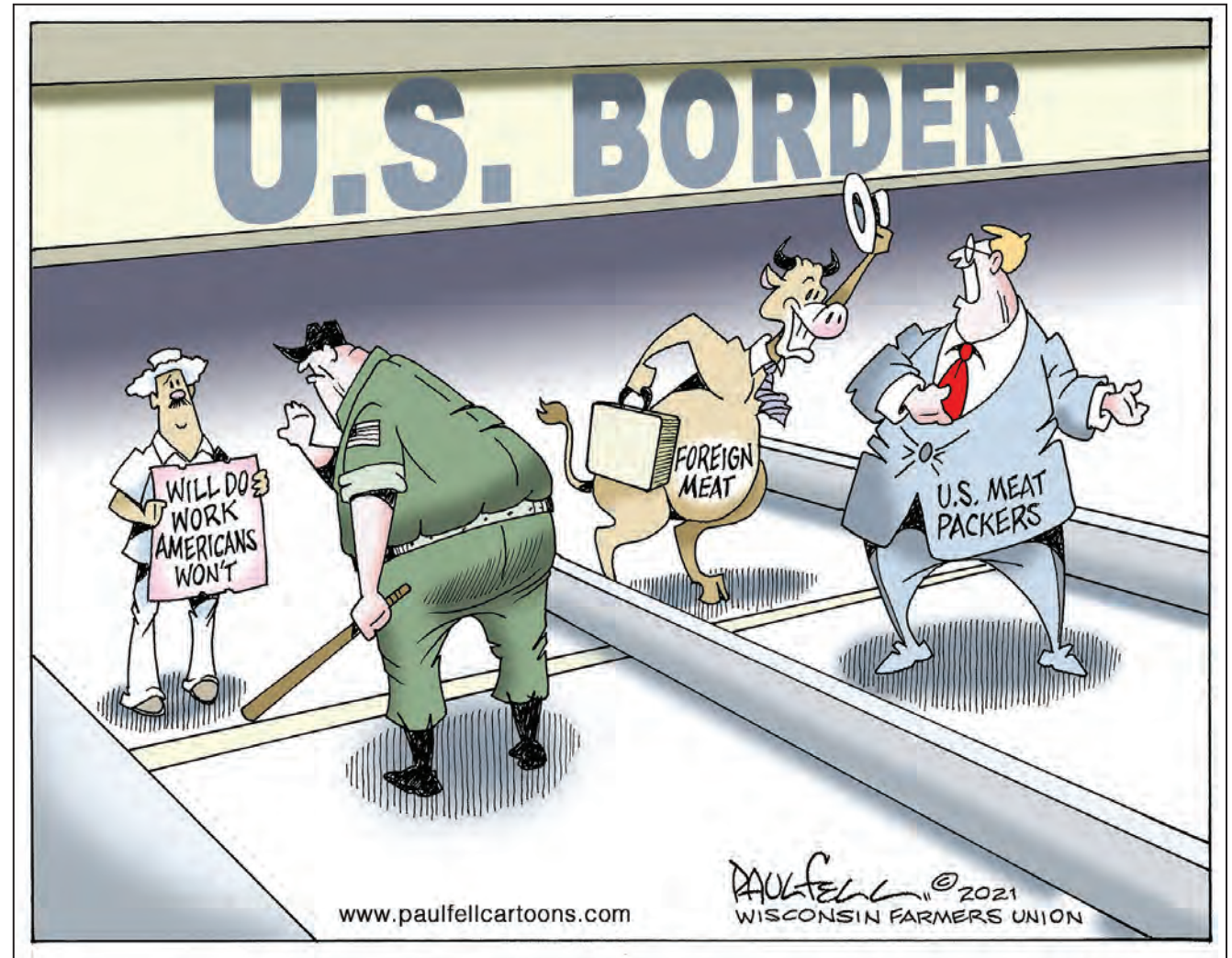
As NFU President Rob Larew noted earlier this week, "American consumers deserve to know where their meat comes from. Whether they want to keep their food dollar in their community, limit their food miles or avoid unsustainable or unethical practices, there are many reasons why someone would want to know what country their meat was raised in. But as things stand, there's no way to determine the origin of beef and pork since the wildly deceptive 'Product of the USA' label can appear on meat that spent its entire life in another country."

Farmers Union, along with the U.S. Cattlemen's Association, was a vocal

advocate of Country-of-Origin Labeling for meat, but the World Trade Organization deemed the labeling discriminatory against Mexican and Canadian cattle and Congress repealed the law. Yet we do label country-of-origin for many other products like lamb, fruits and vegetables, and clothing. Why should beef and pork be different — other than the lobbying power of those oligopolies? It seems that the rights of other countries have risen above the right of Americans to know the origins of their food.

Please educate yourself and join in the efforts to remedy this deeply flawed labeling loophole. It's purely common sense that the "Product of the USA" label be reserved only for meat products derived exclusively from animals born, raised, slaughtered and processed in the United States. You know, for products actually of the USA.

CMN's new president explains leadership philosophy

"Netaenawemakanak" translates to "all my relations" in Menominee. College of Menominee Nation's new president, Christopher Caldwell, also sees it as the school's obligation.

Caldwell, an enrolled Menominee tribal member, told me: "I understand the term goes beyond my family relations to community relations and non-human relations. Our responsibility is sharing what we've learned

with the Menominee people, but also with our Indigenous and non-Indigenous relatives who want to learn from us and take that knowledge back to their own communities."

Before becoming the third president in CMN's history, Caldwell served as the director of the college's Sustainable Development Institute helping to foster local, national and international conversations grounded in Indigenous knowledge. Caldwell explained that SDI's mission is grounded in reflection and dissemination.

"Some see sustainability as a nebulous concept with no local application, but we approach the concept by looking locally and then expanding upward," he said. "That philosophical concept was not difficult to carry over to the president's office."

Caldwell has already demonstrated how this theory could be put into practice in the school's executive office. While he assumed the presidency on July 1, Caldwell has served as the interim president since February 2020. From the get-go, he has looked to the teachings of his people for guidance — particularly, the Menominee practice of diplomacy as a strength of his nation.

"It's practical because it draws from the past, is vision-orientated and steers the nation forward as we address and deal with the uncertainty that will always be there," Caldwell said.

Caldwell noted that during his tenure the school had to contend with "COVID, cyber-attacks and adherence to health and safety protocols while ensuring the quality of the

education experience."

"We've been able to turn COVID into an empowerment, as we've created opportunities to address longstanding funding inequities amongst mainstream and tribal colleges," he said.

In the past year alone, CMN has invested in a learning management platform, funded the training of faculty, upgraded classrooms at both their Keshena and Green Bay campuses and purchased laptops and

portable hotspots for students to use to complete coursework remotely.

Caldwell emphasized: "We didn't just move online. We created a quality experience that in itself provides exciting opportunities of connecting with other communities."

CMN has also progressed towards expanding its degree options. This fall, the school will begin offering courses in a new sustainable agriculture baccalaureate degree, and its new interdisciplinary studies in

sustainability bachelor's is slated to begin in 2022.

Still, Caldwell is looking beyond CMN's immediate future, as was evident in his titling the public lecture that resulted in his hiring "Omaeqnomenewak Maec-kaehkinuhamati-wikamek, Pursuing the Best Path for the Next Seven Generations." Caldwell recognized the potential in the school he now leads.

"CMN is a vital center for relationships connected to language revitalization," he said. "We have resources for high school students and Native students, and we offer a unique experience rooted in a tribal context. We are open to adult learners who want to start or restart their college careers, and our programs offer growth potential through learning by doing."

Caldwell speaks from experience, as he earned his associate's degree in sustainable development from CMN, before earning a bachelor's in natural resources at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a master's degree in environmental science and policy from UW-Green Bay.

"CMN gave me my voice," Caldwell reflected. "It allowed me to expand what I knew, and it pushed me to talk in front of groups."

Currently, Caldwell is also a Ph.D. candidate in environment and resources at UW-Madison's Nelson Institute. He stated, "I'm focusing on Indigenous research methodology, tribal forestry and sustainability science. I'm deepening my understanding and connecting it to a broader understanding of Indigenous responsibility and leadership."

He reflected, "The act of going through the program has been transformational."

Transformations are something Caldwell takes to heart.

"I see my journey as arcs in a circle — community member, adjunct faculty member, administrator and, now, as president," he said.

While these arcs are unique to Caldwell, they provide evidence of the potential he sees for all of his relations.
