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Finger Family Farm owners are Outstanding Young Farmers

Fingers are passionate about their dairy cows, land stewardship

COUNTY LINE — After chatting in the barn for a few minutes, Philip Finger looked over and smiled at a white-faced cow that poked her face through the stanchion.

"She's following us around," he said, smiling and going over to pat the big animal's head. "She's curious about the visitor."

Sure enough, the cow had been enjoying lunch near the bottom door but had ambled along the row as Philip and his wife, Laura, walked and talked about their selection as 2020 Wisconsin Outstanding Young Farmers.

That Philip noticed one individual's behavior out of more than 500 dairy cows illustrated a point they had made a few minutes earlier: Farmers care about all their animals.

"I know who all their moms are, all their dads are, stuff like that," he said.

"And we're still raising all those babies, we're still feeding them every day," Laura said.

Philip and Laura, both 38 years old, are the managing owners of the Finger Family Farm, which dates to 1872. She bought into the farm when they married, and they took over the day-to-day operation from his parents, Jack and Nancy, after the older Finger experienced some health setbacks just over 10 years ago.

"He saw the job we were doing and said, 'Have at it,' pretty much," Philip said. "We feel really fortunate; sometimes, you know, it's hard for especially dads but parents to let the younger generation start decision-making, but he stepped back."

In addition to the dairy operation, the Fingers farm about 1,900 crop acres with a team of 20 full- and

part-time workers – "people who like working with animals, who like working outside, who like caring for animals, because that's what we do," Laura said. They plan to host the 2022 Marinette County Breakfast on the Farm during the homestead's 150th anniversary year.

The Outstanding Young Farmer program recognizes the contributions and achievements of farmers (ages 21-40) who are a positive voice for agriculture. The Fingers said they were "super excited" just to be nominated for the award by Scott Reuss, the area crops and soils agent for the University of Wisconsin Extension.

They were picked from a field of six finalists from around the state; the announcement was made during the annual Wisconsin Outstanding Young Farmer banquet Jan. 25 in Chippewa Falls.

"The other finalists are extraordinary farmers; they're really good stewards of the land, all passionate about their cows," Philip said. "When they called our names –"

"We were shocked," Laura said.

"We weren't expecting it," Philip

said. "I think we both teared up. We were sincerely shocked."

"It's quite an honor, and we're really looking forward to this coming year; we get to represent farmers and the ag community, too," Laura said.

In addition to representing Wisconsin in the 2021 National Outstanding Young Farmers conference a year from now, the Fingers will be involved in a number of local events and will help host the state conference.

Philip of course was born and raised in Wisconsin, attending the UW-Madison; Laura grew up in Hawaii and went to Iowa State University. Both have dairy science degrees, and they met through two ag salesmen who thought they might get along.

They have four children: Alana, 18, who is attending Fox Valley Technical College in its dairy program; P.J., 10; Alisa, 9; and Alivia, 6. All of them have their share of the farm chores.

Laura Finger said she looks forward to having a podium to educate the public about agriculture.

"We want to connect the people who are eating our food to what we really do, what really takes place on a farm, and how farmers do things," she said. "We put forth our best effort, we're all educated, all knowledgeable in our field, and we want to do what's best for the animal and for our consumers. We know everyone's gotta eat clean and safe food, and whether you're a dairy farmer, a crop farmer, a fruit and vegetable grower, that is what your goal is always."

"Farmers are usually extremely passionate about what they grow, what they raise, what they're taking care of," Philip added.

The Fingers work together as a team, as Philip's passion is genetics, while Laura's passion is calves, complementing each other along the way.

They are active in social media, posting humorous "FFF Friday" cartoons and memes on Facebook every week and using that platform to educate the public. They also host tours for local schools and visitors.

The farm is always clean and presentable, Laura said.

"People want to see that the food that they're eating is clean," she said.

Philip and Laura Finger were sponsored by Genex, Valley Vet and Vita Plus. Another local couple, Laura and Tyler Raatz of Oconto Falls, were among the other finalists, sponsored by CP Feeds, Greenstone, Oconto Falls Insurance Center and Riesterer & Schnell.

The opportunity to share that passion through the Outstanding Young Farmers recognition is exciting, Laura said.

"We want people to understand how much farmers care, and how much farmers are involved in their community, and the efforts that they go through to have their animals well fed, clean, safe, (and) sheltered from the elements, and growing crops, making sure that you're being a good steward of the land," she said. "You cannot not be a good steward of the land and expect to get results."

School arsonist faces child abuse charges

3-month-old girl sustained severe brain injury

OCONTO — The man convicted of burning down St. Anthony School in Oconto Falls eight years ago now stands accused of severely injuring a 3-month-old girl in his home.

Vincent J. Enneper, 24, of Oconto Falls, is charged in Oconto County Circuit Court with child abuse intentionally causing great bodily harm, child abuse recklessly causing great harm, first-degree recklessly endangering safety and neglecting a child with the consequence of great bodily harm.

Enneper is scheduled to make an initial appearance Feb. 13 before Judge Jay N. Conley.

According to the criminal complaint, local authorities were notified by doctors at Children's Hospital in Milwaukee, where the child was taken Jan. 9 suffering from at least two skull fractures and brain bleed seizures.

Enneper had been home alone with the baby the day before and

claimed that she fell out his arms and hit her head against the hardwood floor while he was using one hand to prepare a bottle to feed her.

He told investigators "he never uses force with anyone when he's angry," the complaint said.

But a doctor is quoted in the complaint as saying the girl's injuries were "absolutely not consistent" with a fall: "This type of force can be seen when a child is violently slammed, shaken and/or thrown."

The baby's injuries were described as very severe, and the prognosis is that she will have lifelong deficits from a severe brain injury, the complaint said.

Enneper was 16 when he was charged with starting several fires inside the Catholic school on Feb. 21, 2012, causing approximately \$2 million in damage. He told authorities he did it because he was fascinated by fire.

He was sentenced to five years in prison to be followed by 10 years of extended supervision. He is still serving the second phase of that sentence.

The criminal complaint in the 2012 case refers to separate incidents when Ennepner was younger when he injured two cats while he was angry.

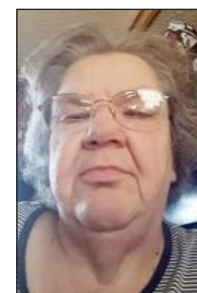

Pulaski yacht-maker eyes temporary shutdown

PULASKI — Marquis Yachts is in active talks to sell its manufacturing facility at 790 Markham Drive in Pulaski. But because the sale probably won't be completed by the end of this month, the company may have to shut down beginning March 1, idling all 344 workers at least temporarily.

"The company has been actively engaged with a couple of potential buyers and other stakeholders to negotiate a sale of the company with the goal to shore-up long-term financing to permit continued operations. As these ongoing efforts continue, the company is working with its limited financial resources to continue operations up through

March 1," said CEO Rob Parmentier in a Wisconsin Business Closing and Mass Layoff notice to the Department of Workforce Development.

Parmentier added that if the company is able to close the sale with a new buyer by Feb. 29, there will be no shutdown.

Marquis is a premium builder of Carver and Marquis Yachts from 34 to 52 feet. Most recently it entered into a collaboration with Toyota Motor Corp. to build a new line of luxury sport yachts under the Japanese firm's Lexus brand.

Marquis was also unable to secure short-term financing to continue operations until the sale of the business is complete, Parmentier said.

Dramatic yuccas in shades of green or variegated green and yellow are another excellent choice for colorful beauty in the garden, even beneath the snowfall.

Of course, there are the dogwoods, shimmering beauty in the landscape and border. There are red twig dogwoods in many forms,

as well as yellow twig dogwood. Plant them side by side for an explosion of winter color all season long.

February brings our beloved northern cardinals into full spring song. Often, by the middle of the month, the cardinals have begun to sing incessantly at sunrise. The male, dressed in beautiful, brilliant red sings from the treetop, often before sunrise, continuing the joyous spring song all throughout the day. Nothing brings color to the garden like a cardinal in full spring glory.

Other colorful songbirds grace our gardens and yards in February,

as well. House finches are dressed in beautiful patches of red. American goldfinches are just now beginning to transform to summer gold. Red-breasted nuthatches are colorful in black, white and rusty red.

Eastern bluebirds wear shades of cobalt and sky blue throughout the winter season. Of course, there are the blue jays, dressed in beautiful blue, black and white. Don't forget the iridescent beauty of wild turkeys on the march.

Mother Nature herself does a great job of bringing color to the February garden and landscape. A variety of mosses and lichens adorn trees, stumps and fallen logs in a blanket of beauty and texture. There are even lichens in beautiful shades of yellow, gold and pink.

Fast start propels Gillett girls past Suring

Strong defense
leads to easy
buckets for Tigers

GILLETT — Fast starts to the first and second half helped the Gillett High School girls basketball team to a convincing 57-32 Marinette & Oconto Conference victory over Suring on Thursday.

Gillett opened the game on a 19-4 run before sealing up its win with a 15-4 run to start the second half. It was a strong Tigers' defense that led to some easy looks on the offensive end during both runs.

The hosts forced turnovers early and often, with Suring not attempting a shot until over four minutes into the contest. By then, Gillett already held an 8-0 lead, with junior Aubrey DeBauch scoring six of the points.

DeBauch added her fourth field goal to make it 10-0 before Suring junior Kylee Stelzer converted the visitor's first shot at the 11:52 mark of the opening half.

Gillett junior Karissa Schaal and sophomore Macy Franti each knocked down a pair of free throws before senior Sydney Young buried a 3-pointer to make it 17-2. After a basket by Suring junior Paige Krueger, Gillett senior Camryn Long hit a shot to make it 19-4.

"We came out and we were flowing together. We had good passes, good looks — we hustled, found the open spots. Just everything clicked tonight," said DeBauch.

"(Gillett) definitely learned that when we drive, if they can stop it and trap it, we couldn't handle their pressure really well," said Krueger. "Once they figured that out, it was kind of hard for us to break it. We also looked back at their game, when we played them the first time (a 41-40 Gillett win on Dec. 14) and we tried to focus on what we did in that game instead of focusing on what we could do in this one. We kind of got caught up in their old defense instead of what their new one and trying to fix that in-game was kind of hard for us."

The teams traded buckets for the rest of the first half, with Gillett taking a 29-11 lead into the break.

Gillett was able to up its lead to 29 about eight minutes into the second half after its 15-4 run.

This time, it was Schaal that led the way for the Tigers, scoring 11 of the points. She hit two 3-pointers and added a three-point play during the stretch.

"Mitch (Woulf, Suring's coach) is a great coach and he knows how to gameplan. So we showed him something he hadn't seen," said Gillett coach Justin Daul, who had his team put on some full-court pressure with lots of trapping that led to steals. "I think we surprised them and I don't think his girls adjusted well to what

Mitch wanted to do. I think our pressure kind of ate them up."

DeBauch finished with 19 points for the Tigers, while Schaal added 18. No other Tiger had over six points, but six other players contributed points in the win.

The conference clash turned into a free-throw contest for much of the rest of the game. The teams combined to take 27 free throws over the final 10:50 of the game.

It was Krueger and Stelzer that got to the line repeatedly for the Eagles, combining for 18 free-throw attempts in the second half alone. Suring made just 11 of its 26 free-throw attempts as a team.

Krueger led the Eagles with 12 points, while Stelzer had 11.

"Gillett's a really good team. They came out and did some things we didn't expect — that they didn't do against us the first time. What they did has been a struggle of ours this year," said Woulf. "But as we got more comfortable and confident, we didn't give up and played until the end, which was awesome to see."

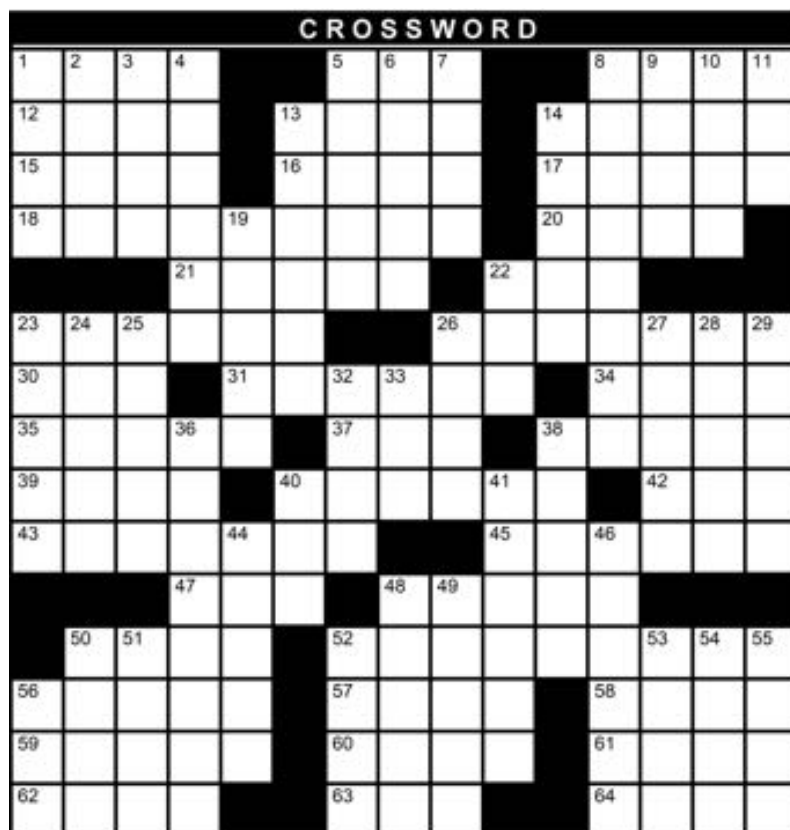

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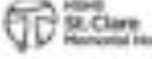
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UWEX schedules corn nutrient and pest management workshop

CECIL — The University of Wisconsin-Extension offices of Marinette, Shawano and Oconto counties are sponsoring a workshop specifically designed to help corn producers optimize their nutrient and pest management practices. The workshop is being held from 9:45 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Feb. 13 at the Green Valley Town Hall, W1734 County Road E.

Nutrients lead off the docket, with Jamie Patton, UW-Madison Nutrition and Pest Management program, reviewing corn's nutrient needs and how we can use recent research to fine tune our nutrient management practices and optimize our return on fertilizer investments.

The rest of the day's topics revolve around successful pest management practices. Bryan Jensen, UW-Madison Integrated Pest Management entomologist, will detail identification, scouting and management of the insect pests that affect corn in northeastern Wisconsin.

After lunch, Dan Heider, also with the UW-Madison IPM program, will discuss and demonstrate how nozzle, adjuvant and formulation selection affect spray performance. He will

utilize a spray table demonstration unit to show how simple changes can positively affect performance and also how mistakes or not paying attention to detail can negatively affect performance of pesticide products.

The final topic will be weed management. Scott Reuss, extension crops and soils agent for Marinette and Oconto counties, will lay the foundation for proper weed management. With new weed species in the region and challenges to timing of weed management events, it is critical that producers are prepared to use effective control measures while still maintaining cost-effectiveness.

This program is open for all producers and consultants. There is a \$12 per person fee for taking part in this event.

As an added bonus, any Certified Crop Advisers who attend the program will earn four CEUs: 1 NM and 3 IPM.
