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DA won't pursue charges in Suring school searches

The Oconto County district attorney said Feb. 15 that charges will not be filed against Suring school officials who ordered a number of students to strip to their underwear to be searched.

More than three dozen parents reportedly came to the school board's Feb. 9 meeting, objecting

to the searches, which were said to have occurred Jan. 18 after a group of students was caught vaping in a school restroom.

In a statement released to Green Bay media, District Attorney Edward Burke said Superintendent Kelly Casper and a school nurse asked six female students to disrobe down to their undergarments while looking for vaping cartridges.

Because the girls' private parts were not exposed to the school officials, the searches do not meet the definition of "strip search" under state law, Burke said.

The school board has held two closed sessions, on Jan. 31 and Feb. 9, under the topic "Confidential student and personnel matters," but the school board and administrators have not commented publicly.

Early morning snowmobile crash claims life in Lakewood

A 50-year-old man died Feb. 12 in a snowmobile crash in the Town of Lakewood.

According to the state Department of Natural Resources, the man was traveling southbound on a trail system during the early morning hours and came to a slight curve near

a road intersection. He went off the trail, traveled through some vegetation and struck a large snowbank at the road intersection adjacent to the trail.

The crash was one of three fatal snowmobile accidents in the state last weekend. The others were in Polk and Bayfield counties.

"Conditions can change, and what

was at first a smooth trail could be hazardous by the end of the day. Take your time and slow down, especially at night," said Lt. Martin Stone, DNR off-highway vehicle administrator. "Safety is an important part of the ride. We want everyone who goes out to enjoy this long-standing tradition in Wisconsin to make it back home safely."

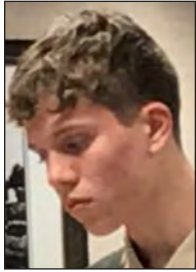

Scout aims to install baby-changing stations at Oconto Falls parks

An Oconto Falls Boy Scout hopes to install baby-changing stations in all five city parks as part of his effort to become an Eagle Scout.

"It's very nice to have a sanitary changing station or bench. It makes the task a lot safer and easier," he said. "And I've come to the realiza-

tion that not all of the city's public bathrooms have changing stations."

The proposal is to install nine baby-changing stations, in the men's and women's restrooms at West Side Beach, East Side Beach,

and Memorial, Pleasant View and Pine Grove parks. There already is a station in the women's restroom at Memorial Park.

Posusta estimates the project will cost \$2,000, which he plans

to raise through sponsorships and other fundraising. He hopes to start in March and have the work completed by summer.

The council endorsed the effort and wished Posusta luck.

Orion Posusta received approval from the Oconto Falls City Council during its Feb. 8 monthly meeting.

Proceedings of Feb. 11

A jury deliberated for slightly over an hour before finding Randall J. Robenhorst, 60, Little Suamico, guilty of three counts of first-degree child sexual assault, child enticement, and three other felony counts, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred May 27. The verdict concluded a two-day trial. Judge Jay N. Conley revoked Robenhorst's bond and ordered him remanded into custody. Sentencing was scheduled for April 25.

After a preliminary hearing, Manuel Antonio Herrera-Hernandez, 33, Green Bay, was bound over and pleaded not guilty to first-degree intentional homicide, in connection with the shooting death of a Green Bay man in the Town of Little Suamico on Feb. 22, 2021. A pre-trial conference was scheduled for April 29. Herrera-Hernandez is also awaiting trial for possession with intent to deliver amphetamine and misdemeanor possession of THC and possession of drug paraphernalia, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Oct. 27, 2020. Two charges of bail jumping filed in May 2021 were dismissed without prejudice, meaning they may be refiled in the future.

Jacob S. Chilcote, 19, Oconto Falls, was placed on three years probation for possession of narcotic drugs and a misdemeanor charge of carrying a concealed weapon, in connection with an incident that occurred Sept. 10. Among other conditions Judge Michael T. Judge ruled that Chilcote must maintain absolute sobriety, serve 90 days in the county jail, undergo an alcohol and other drug abuse assessment, obtain the equivalency of a high school diploma, and obtain and maintain full-time employment.

Rafael Elroy Garay, 36, Pound, waived his right to a preliminary hearing and was bound over on two counts of felony bail jumping in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Jan. 3. Arraignment was scheduled for Feb. 17.

Proceedings of Feb. 10

Allan C. Evans, 34, Abrams, pleaded no contest to operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated (fourth offense), in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred March 31, 2021. Judge Michael T. Judge scheduled sentencing for April 5 and ordered a pre-sentence investigation.

Proceedings of Feb. 9

Robert L. McDermid, 44, Oconto Falls, was placed on three years probation after a prison sentence was imposed and stayed for possession of

methamphetamine in connection with an incident that occurred Jan. 2, 2020. Conley ordered that McDermid must refrain from alcohol or any other drugs without a valid prescription, undergo an alcohol and other drug abuse assessment and follow through, complete any assessments, counseling and treatment as deemed necessary by his corrections agent, and take all medications as prescribed and verified by agent, among other conditions.

A June 1 jury trial was confirmed for William J. Neering, 46, Coleman, on four counts of felony bail jumping, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Sept. 25. A final pre-trial conference is scheduled for May 16. Conley ruled that the trial may not be consolidated with earlier cases: charges of strangulation-suffocation and misdemeanor battery and disorderly conduct, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Nov. 27, 2020; and bail jumping in an alleged Jan. 13, 2021 incident. The newest case will advance to trial first.

A jury trial was rescheduled to March 23-24 for Joshua M. Waschbisch, 32, Oconto, who is charged with possession of methamphetamine, maintaining a drug trafficking place, possession of narcotic drugs, and misdemeanor possession of drug paraphernalia, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred April 30, 2020; bail jumping and misdemeanor resisting or obstructing an officer, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Jan. 27, 2021; and battery by prisoner, aggravated battery of an elderly victim, and two counts of felony bail jumping, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred March 16. The prosecution offered a possible plea agreement, and defense was asked to review the offer and respond by Feb. 18.

Tonya M. Sampley, 45, Waupun, pleaded no contest to misdemeanor possession of THC, in connection with an incident that occurred Feb. 2, 2021. The charge was amended from a felony in a plea agreement. Judge levied fines and court costs totaling \$599.

Bond was set at \$2,500 cash for Christopher J. Robinson, 34, Oconto, after he was charged with possession of methamphetamine and misdemeanor operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated (first offense), in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Feb. 7. His initial appearance was adjourned until Feb. 17.

Proceedings of Feb. 8

Casey J. Kelly, 33, Oconto, waived his right to a preliminary hearing and

was bound over on charges of strangulation-suffocation, bail jumping, and misdemeanor battery and disorderly conduct, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Aug. 11. He was previously charged with first-degree recklessly endangering safety, strangulation-suffocation, aggravated battery, and misdemeanor disorderly conduct in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred March 20, 2021. A plea hearing in both cases was scheduled for March 2.

Proceedings of Feb. 7

Kevin Miguel Reed, 20, Three Lakes, was sentenced to seven years in prison, followed by six years of extended supervision, for two counts of armed robbery, in connection with an incident that occurred June 4. Judge ruled that Reed is eligible for two programs that could lead to early release, but not until after serving five years on the two counts. During extended supervision he must maintain absolute sobriety, have no contact with six named individuals or anyone involved in drug activity, and complete all assessments, counseling and treatment deemed necessary by his corrections agent.

Sawyer James Wheelock, 24, Hobart, was sentenced to 18 months in state prison, followed by two years of extended supervision, for possession of narcotic drugs, and a consecutive nine months in the county jail for misdemeanor bail jumping, in connection with an incident that occurred Dec. 3, 2020. He was given credit for 109 days already served. Judge ruled that during his sentence Wheelock must maintain absolute sobriety; have no contact with anyone known to use, possess, or sell illegal drugs; obtain and maintain full-time employment or school or a combination of both; and comply with an alcohol and other drug abuse assessment and any assessments, counseling and treatment deemed necessary by his corrections agent.

Steven M. Bickel, 37, Lena, was placed on two years probation after a prison sentence was imposed and stayed for possession of narcotic drugs, in connection with an incident that occurred Sept. 10. Judge ruled that among other conditions Bickel must maintain absolute sobriety, undergo an alcohol and other drug abuse assessment and follow through with recommended treatment/counseling, and complete all assessments, counseling and treatment deemed necessary by his probation agent.

Jeffrey S. Wenzel Jr., 21, Oconto, was placed on two years probation

after a prison sentence was imposed and stayed for felony bail jumping, in connection with an incident that occurred Aug. 28. Judge ruled that during probation Wenzel must maintain absolute sobriety; have no contact with anyone known to use, possess, or sell illegal drugs; obtain and maintain full-time employment or school or a combination of both; and comply with an alcohol and other drug abuse assessment and any assessments, counseling and treatment deemed necessary by his corrections agent.

James Richard Cackovic, 23, Bonduel, was placed on two years probation, beginning with six months in the county jail, after a prison sentence was imposed and stayed for possession of methamphetamine, in connection with an incident that occurred Sept. 16. Conley ruled that, among probation conditions, Cackovic must refrain from alcohol, obtain and maintain full-time employment, undergo an alcohol and other drug abuse assessment and follow through, and enroll in and successfully complete all treatment deemed appropriate by the Department of Corrections.

A Feb. 16 jury trial was canceled for Scott Glen Sorenson, 57, De Pere, who is charged with operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated (fourth offense), in connection with an Oct. 10, 2019, crash in the town of Stiles. Instead, a hearing on the state's motion to exclude two defense expert witnesses was scheduled for that day.

Christopher M. Giese, 49, Gillett, waived his right to a preliminary hearing and pleaded not guilty to receiving stolen property, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Nov. 28. A pre-trial conference was scheduled for March 17.

Bond was set at \$2,500 cash for Dane L. Ades, 59, Oconto, after he was charged with strangulation and suffocation, misdemeanor battery and disorderly conduct, in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Feb. 4. His initial appearance was adjourned until Feb. 17.

Park Avenue reconstruction bid awarded

Senior center bids rejected due to being over budget

The Oconto Falls City Council awarded bids Feb. 8 on one of two construction projects being funded by Community Development Block Grants, but the council rejected bids on a second, with one alderman having strong words for the city's consulting firm.

Advance Construction of Green Bay submitted the lowest of eight bids received for the complete reconstruction of Park Avenue, including one alternate bid that substitutes corrugated polyurethane storm sewer pipe for PVC.

Craig Schuh, manager of the civil

engineering department for Ayres and Associates consultants, said the alternates were sought because of supply-chain issues that drive up prices of harder-to-find materials. Going with the alternate saves the city about \$10,700, Schuh said.

Advance Construction will do the job for \$743,720 after the council's unanimous vote.

Schuh had less positive news for aldermen regarding the other project, renovation of the Oconto Falls Senior and Community Center on Caldwell Avenue. Three bids were received for the project, and the low bid of \$1,065,000 was about \$225,000 higher than expected.

Key components of the proposed renovation are a canopy over the front entrance, to allow seniors to enter from a vehicle under cover, and a new elevator to improve access to the basement. The only way that people in wheelchairs can reach the basement now is in a cramped freight

elevator, in effect making half of the center's 50,000 square feet inaccessible to people with disabilities.

Alderman Mat McDermid said Ayres should have offered contractors the opportunity to make an alternate bids to lower the overall cost, much as they did with Park Avenue. One alternate could have eliminated improvements to the basement gathering areas, for example, an important but not necessarily essential part of the job.

"To have this come in \$225,000 over what the budget was is completely unacceptable," McDermid said. "I understand volatility of the marketplace, but you have to have some foresight to see this coming."

McDermid said having alternate bid options for the senior center would have allowed the city to "pick and choose here today and have this project going forward," but instead it will be delayed as the project is rebid.

Schuh said his company would

start work on the new bidding process the following morning.

The city has scheduled a public hearing on both projects for 6:30 p.m. March 8 in the council chambers at City Hall, 500 N. Chestnut Ave., Oconto Falls, to provide an update on the progress of both the senior center improvements and Park Avenue reconstruction projects and to give citizens the opportunity to provide input.

The grants are from the state Department of Administration through the Community Development Block Grant-CLOSE program — so named because the money comes from the now-closed revolving-fund loan program that CDBG once funded.

The city needs to complete the work by this fall before the grant expires. City Administrator Vicki Roberts said there is still plenty of time even with the delay in bidding.

Philip and Laura Finger named National Outstanding Young Farmers 2021

Crivitz couple earns 2022 recognition

Philip and Laura Finger, who operate a family farm that straddles the Oconto-Marinette county line, were selected national winners for 2021 at the annual National Outstanding Young Farmers Awards Congress held Feb. 3-6 in Hilton Head Island, South Carolina. The couple were Wisconsin Outstanding Young Farmers in 2020.

Four national winners were selected for the award based on their progress in an agricultural career, extent of soil and water conservation practices, and contributions to the well-being of the community, state, and nation. Guest Master of Ceremonies Tom Steever of Brownfield Ag News announced the four national winners for 2022 and 2021 after last year's event was postponed. The three other national

winners for 2021 are from Georgia, New Jersey, and New Mexico.

National winners received a savings bond from corporate sponsor John Deere and the opportunity to travel to represent the NOYF at future agricultural events.

Philip and Laura are the managing owners of the Finger Family Farm, which dates to 1872. She bought into the farm when they married, and they took over the day-to-day operation from his parents, Jack and Nancy, just over 12 years ago.

The Fingers operate a dairy and grow alfalfa, corn, and soybeans on a fifth-generation farm. Concentrating on meeting milk production goals by emphasizing cattle comfort and genetic selection along with improving soil quality have been top priorities for the Fingers, who both hold degrees in dairy science.

Striving for a goal of seven pounds per cow of fat and protein components in the milk per day, the

Fingers utilize technology such as collars to monitor estrus activity and genomic monitoring through DNA tissue samples. Laura focuses on calf development, manages the parlor, and oversees facility maintenance. The Fingers strive to present a positive face for agriculture through social media and believe that the role of farmers is to build soil.

A comprehensive nutrient man-

agement program, three separate manure storage facilities, and grass strips to prevent erosion are all components of their conservation program with an ultimate goal of making the farm sustainable for the next generation, children Alana, PJ, Alisa, and Alivia.

The Finger Family Farm is scheduled to host the Marinette County Breakfast on the Farm on June 26, marking the farm's 150th anniversary.

Joseph and Ashley Dudkiewicz, of Crivitz, were announced as 2022 winners. The couple have a beef herd and cash crop about 1500 acres in northwest Wisconsin, a portion of which was purchased by Joe's great-grandfather in 1927, adjacent to the original family homestead which was established in 1896.

Wisconsin is scheduled to host the 2023 National OYF Awards Congress at the Red Lion Hotels - Paper Valley in Appleton from Feb. 16-19, 2023.

A time to mourn, and a time to dance

Pulaski High School
bringing 'Footloose' to
stage over next 2 weekends

Pulaski High School has decided it's just going to cut loose for its winter musical and bring back a 1980s classic with "Footloose."

The musical, started in Broadway in 1998 and based on the 1984 film starring Kevin Bacon, opens Feb. 18 and continues for the next two weekends. Almost 100 students are involved in bringing the story to life, from the cast to the pit orchestra to the crews working behind the scenes.

"We have a lot of talent in our students this year, and we really wanted to highlight a lot of different performers," said director Amy Tubbs. "The nice thing about the script is that a lot of kids get featured in different songs. Everyone gets a chance to shine. It's not a show where four kids are shining."

The story begins with city teenager Ren McCormack, who has grown up in Chicago, learning that he and his mother are having to move to a small town in the middle of nowhere called Bomont. Besides the normal culture shock that comes from putting a city kid in a country town, Ren is shocked to find out that dancing is actually illegal.

The ban on dancing is linked to the town's minister, Shaw Moore, who lost his son in a car accident where four teens who were traveling to a dance were killed. Ren and some of his newfound friends at the high school, including the pastor's daughter who hates Bomont and its conservative nature with a passion, plot to hold a dance in spite of the town council's wishes.

"One of the things we found in the foreword of the script by one of the writers is that someone wrote to him, 'If you replace the word "dancing" with "forgiveness," that's really what the story is,' Tubbs said. "You have a town where there's a horrific accident, and four young people lost their lives on the way to a dance. Then the town preacher decides, no more dancing because we don't want anyone else to be hurt."

Tubbs noted that Ren gets to "heal" over the course of the show because his father left him and his mother, and so there's a somber side

to what appears on the surface as a bright story.

"A lot of times, we think of 'Footloose' as this action and dance, rockin' sockin' fun musical, but there's kind a serious story about forgiveness and moving on and healing," Tubbs said. "We're trying to get that in our message, too."

Although it didn't occur to Tubbs when the school started preparing for the musical, she realizes "Footloose"

brings a message to those who have stopped or delayed regular activities during the pandemic that, eventually, things will come back.

"It's kind of nice to see the arts in particular come back to life again," Tubbs said. "In all areas, the arts were severely shut down and not be able to perform for live audiences. It's coming back to life, and this is a celebration of that, too."

The musical includes a lot of classic

1980s tunes. Besides the titular "Footloose," audiences will get to enjoy "Let's Hear it For the Boy," "Holding Out for a Hero," "I'm Free (Heaven Helps the Man)" and "Almost Paradise."

While most high schools had to stop live theatrical productions during the first full school year of the pandemic, PHS was able to move its musical back to the spring, Tubbs said, but had to limit the audience and keep cast members physically distanced on the stage and masked. She said "Footloose" will be the first production where the school will be able to house a full audience again.

"It wasn't a true performance. It was really empty, and it felt weird in here," Tubbs said of the delayed musical in 2021. "Last fall, we were able to do our one-act plays, but this is our biggest first production, that's for sure."

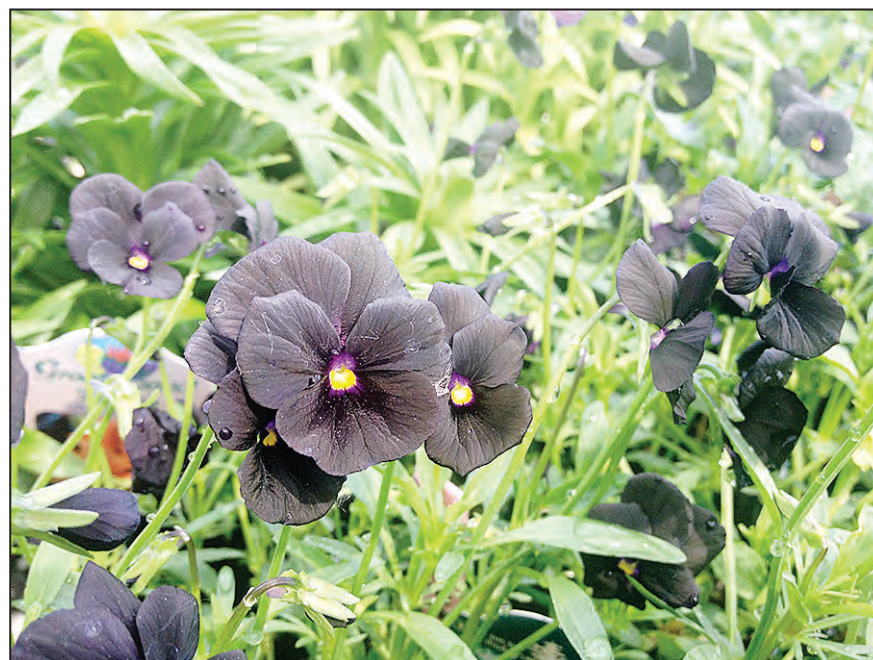

Suspect in custody after credit union robbery

One person is in custody after a robbery at Capital Credit Union in Shawano on Feb. 14.

After a short foot pursuit, the subject actively resisted officers' attempts to place the suspect under arrest. After a Taser deployment the person was taken into custody without injury, Rabideau said.

An unspecified amount of money in a bank bag was recovered. The chief said it is believed the person in custody is the only suspect and there is no further danger to the public, and the investigation remains active.

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Pamonicutt gets 2 years for running over ex

Judge determines there must be prison term, even though relationship was abusive

A Keshena woman who ran over a former boyfriend with a SUV was sentenced Thursday in federal court to two years in prison to be followed by three years' supervised release.

According to court documents, Michelle Pamonicutt, 36, had been in a long-term but abusive relationship with Gerald Hayes, the father of three of her four children.

They had apparently separated but bumped into each at a birthday party on the night of Oct. 19, 2019. Both were extremely intoxicated, and in later tests Hayes had a 0.207 blood-alcohol level and Pamonicutt, 0.134.

The two argued while Hayes drove Pamonicutt along Go Around Road and Keshena Lake Road on the Menominee Reservation. Hayes got out of the vehicle and walked on the shoulder of the road. Pamonicutt got behind the wheel and struck Hayes as

he fled into a roadside ditch. Pamonicutt then drove into the ditch and ran over Hayes.

Hayes was taken by air to Theda-Care Medical Center, where he had surgery on his legs, suffered spinal fractures, and had a concussion resulting in a traumatic brain injury. Some injuries will permanently affect his physical abilities.

A review of vehicle's electronic data module indicated that the Pamonicutt drove into Hayes full throttle for at least five seconds before impact.

Pamonicutt was indicted for assault with the intent to commit murder. She pled guilty last October to assault with a deadly weapon.

At sentencing Thursday, Pamonicutt's attorney, Krista Halla-Valdes, sought a sentence of probation, saying that this was her client's only conviction, she hasn't drank alcohol since October 2019, and she is the primary caretaker for three of her children.

Pamonicutt has filed suit to collect child support for their children while Pamonicutt had worked at the Menominee Casino Resort for 14 months until she couldn't be employed there due to her conviction. Neverthe-

less, she got another job, as she is the sole support for her children.

Halla-Valdes said the beatings and mental abuse Hayes inflicted on Pamonicutt doesn't excuse her conduct but should be a mitigating factor in the sentence Pamonicutt receives.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Andrew Maier told District Judge William Griesbach that Pamonicutt has already received a break by allowing to plea guilty to an assault charge which has a maximum 10-year sentence instead of the original charge, which carries a 20-year maximum sentence.

Hayes' serious injuries were caused by Pamonicutt, and her sentence should reflect the need to punish her for that and deter others from doing the same, Maier said.

Despite being a domestic violence victim, Pamonicutt didn't have the right to run over Hayes, Maier said. She didn't call 911 to report the situation and wasn't initially honest with the investigator at the scene.

In the need to deter others, Maier said the reservation is like a series of small towns where the acts of others are conveyed on social media and by texting.

The message Pamonicutt's sentence should send to the community is "not take the law into their own hands," when they feel they've been wronged. Also, "Walk away when you have control over the situation," Maier said.

He recommended a sentence within the 24- to 36-month advisory guideline range.

Pamonicutt told Griesbach that she wasn't trying to harm Hayes as much as she was trying to protect herself.

Griesbach disagreed. Although she has no need for rehabilitation and has been sober since the offense, Pamonicutt is deserving of some amount of punishment, which is the primary purpose of sentencing, Griesbach said.

Pamonicutt wasn't protecting herself but her actions reflected an anger toward Hayes who had abused her, the judge said.

"You were in a car; he was in a ditch. If you needed to get away, you could have driven away," Griesbach said. "We're fortunate here that we're not dealing with a death."

Griesbach granted Pamonicutt's request to report to prison no earlier than April 29 in order to resettle her children.

Packers' Rodgers earns 4th MVP award

QB still undecided on future

A four-time MVP, three Super Bowl players and the beginning of a brother act.

The Associated Press 2021 NFL awards had a bit of everything, starting with Aaron Rodgers becoming the fifth player to repeat as Most Valuable Player.

"It is kind of surreal sitting here," Rodgers said. "Being a four-time MVP is crazy."

"They're all different. They've all unique in their own ways and this one feels the sweetest."

Despite the turmoil of training camp and the headlines created by the Green Bay quarterback when he misled the public on his COVID-19 vaccination, Rodgers' play on the field was superb. So much so that he earned 39 votes from a nationwide panel of 50 media members who regularly cover the NFL. Not even one of Tom Brady's best performances — in his final season — came close in the MVP race, with the Buccaneers quarterback getting 10 votes.

Only Peyton Manning with five MVP awards is ahead of Rodgers, who said no announcement on his future in the NFL is imminent.

"There was something to how I felt walking off the field," he said. "I had great conversations with the Packers before I left town. There

have been changes to the staff. Just comes down to weighing where I am at mentally and what the commitment is.

"I don't fear retirement and moving on. I'm very proud of what I have accomplished over being in Green Bay for 17 years. Also still highly competitive and bitter taste from the NFC game. I was frustrated about things during the offseason and I feel like there's so much growth. There were some things voiced privately, and I am thankful for the response. There were things done to make me feel special and important."

Rams wide receiver Cooper Kupp got one vote for MVP, but he easily took top offensive player honors. Kupp and Cincinnati quarterback Joe Burrow (Comeback Player) and wideout Ja'Marr Chase (Offensive Rookie) squared off in Super Bowl.

Steelers edge rusher T.J. Watt, a unanimous All-Pro like Kupp, led the NFL in sacks with a record-tying 22½. He joined brother J.J., a three-time winner of Defensive Player of the Year.

Dallas linebacker Micah Parsons, who came in second to Watt for top defensive player — but 37 votes behind — was a unanimous choice for Defensive Rookie of the Year. Parsons not only helped the Cowboys turn around their defensive performance this season, but he was so dynamic he helped coordinator Dan Quinn win the assistant coach award.

Mike Vrabel's work with the

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Titans earned him Coach of the Year. Despite using a record for a non-strike season 91 players, and losing his very best, running back Derrick Henry, for half the schedule, Vrabel led Tennessee to the AFC

South crown and the conference's top seed.

Rams veteran tackle Andrew Whitworth, who also played for the Bengals, won the league's Walter Payton Man of the Year award.

Mandates mean less choice in Wisconsin schools

Every session, state legislators propose and consider a number of mandates (requirements enforced by state law) on our local schools. These almost always deal with worthy topics and, considered by themselves, might not seem like that big of a deal for schools to implement.

The problem comes when you consider that there are only so many hours of instruction in a school day, and there are new instructional mandates proposed every legislative session. This session, we have seen mandates proposed that would require schools to provide instruction on civics, cursive writing and teen dating violence prevention, among others. The latest example is a bill (Assembly Bill 899) that would require a full-year financial literacy course as an additional high school graduation requirement.

You may be thinking financial

literacy is important. We agree. Did you know that Wisconsin recently adopted a law (2017 WI Act 94) that requires each school board to adopt financial literacy academic standards? In fact, schools have already begun incorporating financial literacy into their curriculums not just in high school but across all grade levels K-12.

As a former school superintendent, I know how challenging it would be to fit a full year of any additional graduation requirement into a school's offerings, especially in the many small, rural schools throughout Wisconsin. I'm sure larger schools would be challenged in their own unique ways.

More importantly, as a parent of a recent high school graduate with two other children in high school, I know how many classes my kids have wanted to take but were not able to because of current requirements and scheduling limitations. This new mandate would only exacerbate course selection challenges for high school students.

The Wisconsin Association of School Boards is concerned that this mandate would force school boards to reduce or eliminate critical programming at the high school level. These include offerings that prepare students for careers in their communities, provide college credit opportunities that save students time and tuition, or prepare students via higher-level courses needed for college entrance requirements.

School districts that wish to offer a specific course in financial lit-

eracy as a graduation requirement for their district can already do so voluntarily. They don't need a mandate from the state to take that step. However, for the many school districts facing teacher shortages and struggling simply to keep their doors open for in-person instruction, the last thing they need is yet another unfunded mandate.

Let's say no to more state mandates that are a recipe for a "one size fits all" education among 421 different and unique public schools. Instead, let's advocate for maximum flexibility for students to take classes where they can explore areas of interest for their continuing education or employment upon graduation.

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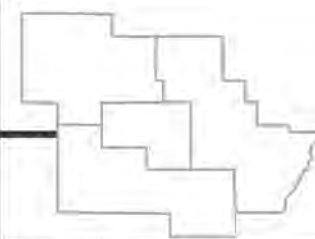

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WHAT IS CORONARY ARTERY DISEASE (CAD)?

Coronary is the Latin term for heart. Like the rest of your body, the heart needs a supply of oxygen and nutrients in the blood to function properly. This life-threatening situation occurs when the already narrowed coronary arteries become completely blocked. Blood flow stops, and unless it is restored, permanent damage and death can occur.

There are seven major risk factors for heart disease that you have control over and can modify.

3. Having high blood pressure.
4. Controlling stress.

Men with heart disease often have a much different experience. Their symptoms may include: crushing chest pain or pressure, shortness of breath, dizziness, nausea, gray or clammy skin, and fainting spells.

It is important to note that every person is different. You may experience all, some or even NONE of these symptoms.
