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Council awards plaza construction bid

City still looking for funding sources to fully pay for project

The Shawano Common Council approved Peters Concrete to construct the long-anticipated downtown plaza, and it is working to make sure there's funding available to complete the project.

Peters Concrete submitted a base bid just shy of \$2 million, but with the alternates added in, the bid came to over \$2.35 million. Peters was the lowest bid, coming in behind Vinton Construction, which had a bid around \$2.58 million, and Janke Contractors, which submitted a bid for over \$2.74 million.

However, all of the bids came in over the city's cost estimates, which totaled \$1.98 million for the base plaza and five alternate projects — parking renovations for Washington Street, a tabletop for the street that would connect the plaza with Franklin Park, a trellis with hanging benches, precast block seat walls and mound seat walls.

In the motion to approve, the council took out the alternate bid for the trellis, which is expected to trim \$141,950 from the project. However, the amenity is not dead and could be approved in March or April if the city can find additional funding, according to City Administrator Eddie Sheppard.

"Costs came in significantly higher than we hoped," he said. "We left the last meeting with some optimism and a pretty strong feeling that the council wanted to move forward."

Sheppard told the council that the city has been able to come up with \$760,000 in additional funds after estimates jumped up from the original \$1.5 million due to the rise in the costs of construction materials from supply-chain issues. One of those funding sources was delaying the renovation of City Hall due to bids coming in way over estimates,

which freed \$80,000. The council rejected all of the bids earlier in its meeting.

"We saw those prices were outrageous compared to what we expected during normal building times," Sheppard said. "I think it was prudent for us to push that back."

Sheppard noted that there was \$120,000 available through the city's Tax Incremental Finance District 4, and Shawano Municipal Utilities is contributing its costs for demolition and burying lines, which is estimated to be around \$100,000. Charlie Harvey, owner of Charlie's County Market, donated \$100,000 to the project, and additional funding is coming through the American Rescue Plan Act money the city received from the federal government.

"That's what we've been doing the last few weeks, trying to move some things around so we can bring you back a project you'd feel comfortable with approving," Sheppard said.

He noted that there are still meetings planned with businesses and organizations, so the trellis could still become a reality, as the project isn't expected to break ground until spring.

"It gives you a little bit of flexibility, but I don't think we could extend that into May or June because it would put them way behind," said Sheppard, who had previously announced the intent to have the plaza finished by fall. "The other alternative is you say, 'You know what? We're going to include it.'"

Alderman Brad Keuschel suggested the possibility of holding off the tabletop planned for Washington Street, noting that would trim an additional \$100,000 and would not impact the plaza itself, just its connection with Franklin Park.

Brandon Herbert with Strand Associates, the design firm that has been overseeing the plaza project,

warned that even though that could be done later, it might require redoing some sidewalks and curbs, and it would impact the parking area that would be part of the project. That would result in increased costs.

"If you tried to bid that on its own, I would recommend bidding that with something else, like your annual street utilities project," Herbert said. "If you did it on its own, it would be quite a bit more expensive, I think."

Herbert added that the connection between the plaza and Franklin Park was a key desire when the ad-hoc steering committee met to determine what would go in the plaza.

Alderman Kevin Barkow recommended the tabletop remain, pointing out that Harvey's \$100,000 donation could result in others in the community opening their wallets to give.

"Being the optimistic person I try to be, I'd like to think other businesses are going to step forward and do the right thing," Barkow said.

The proposed plaza is going to include a curving blue path that connects the two segments of the plaza that is expected to amplify the city's identity of being a Wolf River community. The plaza will also include an homage to the local Native American tribes, which would include artwork of the Menominee sacred clans. There will also be a lighted water feature and an area where performers could hold shows.

The plaza picked up momentum in 2021 as the city learned it had \$1 million in Community Development Block Grant funding to utilize, which also included \$500,000 in matching funds. However, the city learned last fall that the plaza's projected costs were going to be at least \$2 million.

Bird scooters could be coming to Shawano

Scooters seen as ride-share option to help locals, tourists

Bird scooters could be coming to Shawano in the near future, giving another ride-share option for the community.

Julianne Rotter, a spokeswoman for Bird, gave a presentation Feb. 9 to the Shawano Common Council, and the idea generated interest from the council members. She noted that Bird has already established a presence in larger cities like Green Bay and Appleton, but the company is interested in bringing its scooters into smaller communities, too.

"We're hoping to expand into other Wisconsin communities — not just the larger metropolitan areas, but the smaller towns as well, as we see it as a huge transportation benefit for the community," Rotter said. "What we're hoping to do in Shawano is allow this public transportation option. Users can find scooters throughout the community or on the map functionality on the Bird application on their phones."

Users would be able to scan the scooter with the app to unlock it and then be able to take it to their destination, according to Rotter. Then other users can utilize the scooters when they're available again.

"It's multiple short trips per scooter per day," Rotter said. "It will allow more access to the community."

Rotter said Bird is looking at putting 50 scooters in Shawano to start this summer, what she called a "small fleet."

City Administrator Eddie Sheppard has been communicating with Rotter in recent weeks and told the council the scooters could be configured to Shawano's unique needs.

"One of the things I brought up as a concern was control over where they can go," Sheppard said. "Some roads may not be appropriate for that and could cause danger and safety issues. They can program them so they will just shut down when they reach those spaces. You'd be able to design where you want them, how you want to utilize them — mainly on Main Street and downtown."

The scooters could also be programmed with set hours of operation, which could provide an option for people wanting to get around at night, according to Sheppard.

"After your normal day, after the City Cab is done, transportation options are fairly limited," he said. "Does that mean that everybody's going to go out at night via scooter? Probably not, but it's an option at least."

Shawano has also reached out to other communities in its research, Sheppard said, and found out the scooters would be good to have when tourists come to town.

Rotter noted that the scooters can also be programmed to avoid areas where major events are going on, like when the downtown area has its summer festivities or when Sun Drop Dayz takes place in early June. Bird is still working to find a local community business that would tend to the scooters, such as charging them when the batteries get low and making sure they're in the right place for users to find.

The council expressed interest in having the scooters in Shawano. Alderwoman Rhonda Strebel noted that Shawano is not the kindest to folks who walk or ride bikes in the community, so that would need to be addressed, in her view.

"It seems like bigger cities are more pedestrian-savvy and a little more user-friendly, where they know

to stop with crosswalks and watch for pedestrians," Strebel said. "Shawano, we struggle with that a bit just

for pedestrian crossings. What is the learning curve for getting a community on board?"

Rotter said that Bird is seeing more use from its scooters than it does from the bikes it offers to communities.

"We don't see an issue with getting people on board to ride these vehicles," Rotter said. "It's really the same rules of the road there (compared with bicyclists)."

Alderman Brad Keuschel said he's tried other ride-share scooters like Lime when he's visited other cities and thinks it could work for Shawano.

"I've been to Nashville and Denver with groups, and we used the Lime scooters. We used them all the time when we were down there, and they were awesome," Keuschel said. "I'd be really excited to see them come to Shawano."

Mowing, snow removal penalties could go up

Shawano looks at charging \$150 for first offense and increasing for additional violations

Folks in Shawano who think it's easier to let the city remove snow from their sidewalks and mow tall grass and then just pay the piper could be in for a rude awakening come the spring.

The city is looking at increasing the penalties for scofflaws who don't obey regulations on mowing lawns and shoveling snow. Currently, the city charges the cost of doing the work for each offense, about \$25 for snow removal and \$50 for lawn mowing. For the second offense and after, the city tacks on a \$25 administrative fee.

David Moesch, planning and zoning administrator, is recommending the penalties increase so that it's \$150 for the first offense, and then the penalty increases by \$20 for each additional offense. He presented the recommendations Feb. 9 to the Shawano Common Council and will formally ask for action when the council meets again March 9.

Moesch said the city is having problems with the same people over and over again, and it was rare for it to be an isolated incident of neglecting to shovel driveways or

trimming grass. Research was done with Pulaski, Sturgeon Bay and Merrill, and it was discovered that Shawano's fees were peanuts by comparison — Pulaski and Sturgeon Bay charge the \$150 recommended for Shawano to adopt, while Merrill charges \$500 per offense, according to Moesch.

"We just came to the realization that we do not charge much," Moesch said.

The city had to send someone out to cut a property owner's grass on 48 occasions in 2021, according to a memo from Moesch and Dena Henning, the city's code enforcement officer. As for the snow removal, the city has had to send out crews 63 times in a two-month period ending Feb. 4. Moesch noted that there are currently 15-20 problem properties the city has to deal with.

The current fees charged by the city are the cheapest in the area, according to City Administrator Eddie Sheppard, as snow removal companies charge more.

"We've become the service of choice, and I think, at that point, we're probably undercharging for that service," Sheppard said. "That's not the business we want to be in."

The recommendations for snow removal are also going to be to extend the timeframe from 24 hours after a snowfall to 48, and it would only be required when there is 2 inches of snow or more, or when plows are dispatched to side streets. The recommendations for grass mowing will increase the length where mowing will be from 6 inches to either 8 or 10 inches.

"If we're going to assess that fee, are we going to charge someone who doesn't shovel a 1-inch snowfall?" Sheppard said. "A lot of cities base it on, if our city plows don't go out and hit the neighborhood streets, that's the threshold."

If the recommendations pass in March, the grass regulations would take effect in the spring, and the snow regulations would take effect next winter, according to Sheppard.

Alderwoman Rhonda Strebel agreed that the current fees are too low, and out-of-state landlords have no issue with just paying the penalty for the city to do the work.

"For some landlords who live in Arizona and they rent a home here, and you say, if you're not going to get this lawn cut, we're going to charge 25 bucks, they'll just say to do it," Strebel said. "It's probably

one less headache for him to deal with."

Alderman Kevin Barkow suggested that, to make it look really unattractive, to charge a fee that's an average of the three municipalities researched, which would put the fee close to \$270 for a first offense.

"That would make it a little more unattractive to mow their lawn for them," Barkow said.

Moesch noted there have been some instances during the pandemic where people were unaware that a city official had put a tag on their door, as people with positive cases have avoided answering the door and potentially spreading COVID-19.

"We just tell them to work on out, and we have discretion, obviously," Moesch said. "However, it's mostly the same folks over and over."

The snow and grass violations are just the start of code enforcement issues the council wants to see dealt with, such as garbage, and city staff will be bringing recommendations for other issues in the coming months.

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French's review hearing scheduled for March

A time to mourn, and a time to dance

Pulaski High School
bringing 'Footloose' to
stage over next 2 weekends

Pulaski High School has decided it's just going to cut loose for its winter musical and bring back a 1980s classic with "Footloose."

The musical, started in Broadway in 1998 and based on the 1984 film starring Kevin Bacon, opens Feb. 18 and continues for the next two weekends. Almost 100 students are involved in bringing the story to life, from the cast to the pit orchestra to the crews working behind the scenes.

"We have a lot of talent in our students this year, and we really wanted to highlight a lot of different performers," said director Amy Tubbs. "The nice thing about the script is that a lot of kids get featured in different songs. Everyone gets a chance to shine. It's not a show where four kids are shining."

The story begins with city teenager Ren McCormack, who has grown up in Chicago, learning that he and his mother are having to move to a small town in the middle of nowhere called Bomont. Besides the normal culture shock that comes from putting a city kid in a country town, Ren is shocked to find out that dancing is actually illegal.

The ban on dancing is linked to the town's minister, Shaw Moore, who lost his son in a car accident where four teens who were traveling to a dance were killed. Ren and some of his newfound friends at the high school, including the pastor's daughter who hates Bomont and its conservative nature with a passion, plot to hold a dance in spite of the town council's wishes.

"One of the things we found in the foreword of the script by one of the writers is that someone wrote to him, 'If you replace the word "dancing" with "forgiveness," that's really what the story is," Tubbs said. "You have a town where there's a horrific accident, and four young people lost their lives on the way to a dance. Then the town preacher decides, no more dancing because we don't want anyone else to be hurt."

Tubbs noted that Ren gets to "heal" over the course of the show because his father left him and his mother, and so there's a somber side

to what appears on the surface as a bright story.

"A lot of times, we think of 'Footloose' as this action and dance, rockin' sockin' fun musical, but there's kind a serious story about forgiveness and moving on and healing," Tubbs said. "We're trying to get that in our message, too."

Although it didn't occur to Tubbs when the school started preparing for the musical, she realizes "Footloose"

brings a message to those who have stopped or delayed regular activities during the pandemic that, eventually, things will come back.

"It's kind of nice to see the arts in particular come back to life again," Tubbs said. "In all areas, the arts were severely shut down and not be able to perform for live audiences. It's coming back to life, and this is a celebration of that, too."

The musical includes a lot of classic

1980s tunes. Besides the titular "Footloose," audiences will get to enjoy "Let's Hear it For the Boy," "Holding Out for a Hero," "I'm Free (Heaven Helps the Man)" and "Almost Paradise."

While most high schools had to stop live theatrical productions during the first full school year of the pandemic, PHS was able to move its musical back to the spring, Tubbs said, but had to limit the audience and keep cast members physically distanced on the stage and masked. She said "Footloose" will be the first production where the school will be able to house a full audience again.

"It wasn't a true performance. It was really empty, and it felt weird in here," Tubbs said of the delayed musical in 2021. "Last fall, we were able to do our one-act plays, but this is our biggest first production, that's for sure."

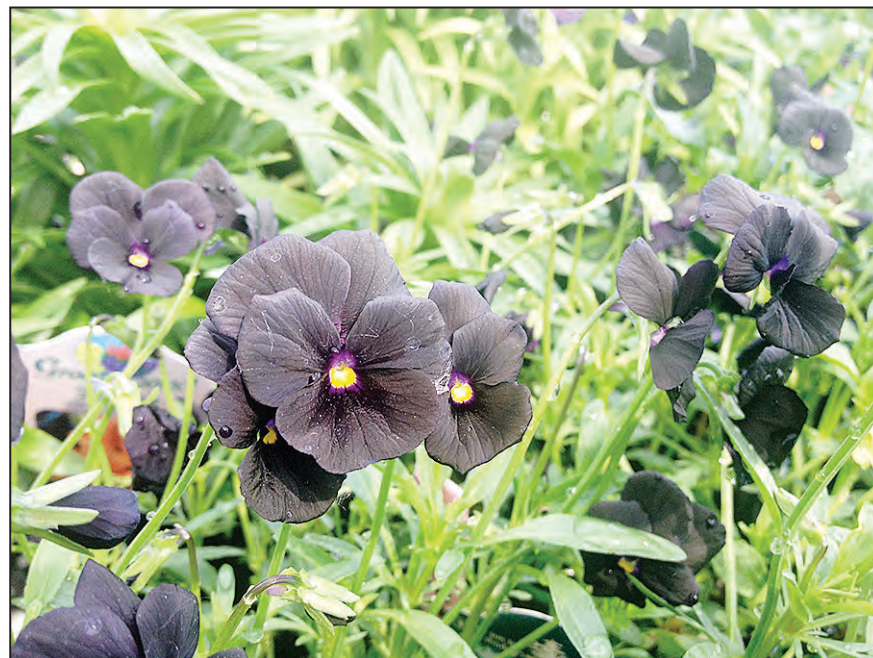

Suspect in custody after credit union robbery

One person is in custody after a robbery at Capital Credit Union in Shawano on Feb. 14.

Police Chief Brad Rabideau said officers responded to a hold-up alarm at about 2:50 p.m., and when they arrived, they saw an individual exit the building. They began giving verbal commands, but the person instead fled on foot.

After a short foot pursuit, the subject actively resisted officers' attempts to place the suspect under arrest. After a Taser deployment the person was taken into custody without injury, Rabideau said.

An unspecified amount of money in a bank bag was recovered. The chief said it is believed the person in custody is the only suspect and there is no further danger to the public, and the investigation remains active.

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Pamonicutt gets 2 years for running over ex

Judge determines there must be prison term, even though relationship was abusive

A Keshena woman who ran over a former boyfriend with a SUV was sentenced Thursday in federal court to two years in prison to be followed by three years' supervised release.

According to court documents, Michelle Pamonicutt, 36, had been in a long-term but abusive relationship with Gerald Hayes, the father of three of her four children.

They had apparently separated but bumped into each at a birthday party on the night of Oct. 19, 2019. Both were extremely intoxicated, and in later tests Hayes had a 0.207 blood-alcohol level and Pamonicutt, 0.134.

The two argued while Hayes drove Pamonicutt along Go Around Road and Keshena Lake Road on the Menominee Reservation. Hayes got out of the vehicle and walked on the shoulder of the road. Pamonicutt got behind the wheel and struck Hayes as

he fled into a roadside ditch. Pamonicutt then drove into the ditch and ran over Hayes.

Hayes was taken by air to Theda-Care Medical Center, where he had surgery on his legs, suffered spinal fractures, and had a concussion resulting in a traumatic brain injury. Some injuries will permanently affect his physical abilities.

A review of vehicle's electronic data module indicated that the Pamonicutt drove into Hayes full throttle for at least five seconds before impact.

Pamonicutt was indicted for assault with the intent to commit murder. She pled guilty last October to assault with a deadly weapon.

At sentencing Thursday, Pamonicutt's attorney, Krista Halla-Valdes, sought a sentence of probation, saying that this was her client's only conviction, she hasn't drank alcohol since October 2019, and she is the primary caretaker for three of her children.

Pamonicutt has filed suit to collect child support for their children while Pamonicutt had worked at the Menominee Casino Resort for 14 months until she couldn't be employed there due to her conviction. Neverthe-

less, she got another job, as she is the sole support for her children.

Halla-Valdes said the beatings and mental abuse Hayes inflicted on Pamonicutt doesn't excuse her conduct but should be a mitigating factor in the sentence Pamonicutt receives.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Andrew Maier told District Judge William Griesbach that Pamonicutt has already received a break by allowing to plea guilty to an assault charge which has a maximum 10-year sentence instead of the original charge, which carries a 20-year maximum sentence.

Hayes' serious injuries were caused by Pamonicutt, and her sentence should reflect the need to punish her for that and deter others from doing the same, Maier said.

Despite being a domestic violence victim, Pamonicutt didn't have the right to run over Hayes, Maier said. She didn't call 911 to report the situation and wasn't initially honest with the investigator at the scene.

In the need to deter others, Maier said the reservation is like a series of small towns where the acts of others are conveyed on social media and by texting.

The message Pamonicutt's sentence should send to the community is "not take the law into their own hands," when they feel they've been wronged. Also, "Walk away when you have control over the situation," Maier said.

He recommended a sentence within the 24- to 36-month advisory guideline range.

Pamonicutt told Griesbach that she wasn't trying to harm Hayes as much as she was trying to protect herself.

Griesbach disagreed. Although she has no need for rehabilitation and has been sober since the offense, Pamonicutt is deserving of some amount of punishment, which is the primary purpose of sentencing, Griesbach said.

Pamonicutt wasn't protecting herself but her actions reflected an anger toward Hayes who had abused her, the judge said.

"You were in a car; he was in a ditch. If you needed to get away, you could have driven away," Griesbach said. "We're fortunate here that we're not dealing with a death."

Griesbach granted Pamonicutt's request to report to prison no earlier than April 29 in order to resettle her children.

The Pulaski High School wrestling team won the Division 1 Shawano Regional and had 12 individual wrestlers qualify for sectionals after competing Feb. 12 in Shawano.

Pulaski piled up 233.5 points, outlasting Bay Port (201).

"This is what we have been working for," said Pulaski coach Nate Preslaski. "Winning the regional and getting an opportunity to compete at the team sectional is exciting for our program."

"We have a great group of boys. They show up and work every day. The coaches in our program do a great job from the youth to middle school level. We have a bunch of really good wrestlers who are starting to breakthrough and make a name for themselves. We are excited for the next few weeks."

To advance to sectionals as an individual in Division 1, a wrestler had to place in the top four in their weight class.

Mandates mean less choice in Wisconsin schools

Every session, state legislators propose and consider a number of mandates (requirements enforced by state law) on our local schools. These almost always deal with worthy topics and, considered by themselves, might not seem like that big of a deal for schools to implement.

The problem comes when you consider that there are only so many hours of instruction in a school day, and there are new instructional mandates proposed every legislative session. This session, we have seen mandates proposed that would require schools to provide instruction on civics, cursive writing and teen dating violence prevention, among others. The latest example is a bill (Assembly Bill 899) that would require a full-year financial literacy course as an additional high school graduation requirement.

You may be thinking financial

literacy is important. We agree. Did you know that Wisconsin recently adopted a law (2017 WI Act 94) that requires each school board to adopt financial literacy academic standards? In fact, schools have already begun incorporating financial literacy into their curriculums not just in high school but across all grade levels K-12.

As a former school superintendent, I know how challenging it would be to fit a full year of any additional graduation requirement into a school's offerings, especially in the many small, rural schools throughout Wisconsin. I'm sure larger schools would be challenged in their own unique ways.

More importantly, as a parent of a recent high school graduate with two other children in high school, I know how many classes my kids have wanted to take but were not able to because of current requirements and scheduling limitations. This new mandate would only exacerbate course selection challenges for high school students.

The Wisconsin Association of School Boards is concerned that this mandate would force school boards to reduce or eliminate critical programming at the high school level. These include offerings that prepare students for careers in their communities, provide college credit opportunities that save students time and tuition, or prepare students via higher-level courses needed for college entrance requirements.

School districts that wish to offer a specific course in financial lit-

eracy as a graduation requirement for their district can already do so voluntarily. They don't need a mandate from the state to take that step. However, for the many school districts facing teacher shortages and struggling simply to keep their doors open for in-person instruction, the last thing they need is yet another unfunded mandate.

Let's say no to more state mandates that are a recipe for a "one size fits all" education among 421 different and unique public schools. Instead, let's advocate for maximum flexibility for students to take classes where they can explore areas of interest for their continuing education or employment upon graduation.

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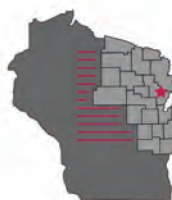
